25 years of Honoring C. Eric Lincoln's Lectureship Series

The C. Eric Lincoln Lectureship Series was founded in 1983 by graduates of former Clark College in honor of their professor and mentor, Dr. Lincoln. While in school, these students had been taught and motivated by the young Dr. Lincoln, who began his scholarly career at Clark College in 1954. In a time when there were few positive male role models, Dr. Lincoln mentored his students, offering his apartment as a kind of intellectual "watering hole" and making his own fledgling library continuously available. More important perhaps, Dr. Lincoln was personally accessible, encouraging scholarly debates and discussions that often extended well beyond class time and office hours. Dr. Lincoln's personal interest in his students was rewarded, as many of them became ministers, doctors, lawyers, college presidents and other professionals. This year's Lecturer was Dr. Albert J. Raboteau, the Henry W. Putnam Professor of Religion at Princeton University.

The students at Clark Atlanta University joined tens of thousands of individuals from across the country in what is being called one of the biggest civil rights marches in years. On September 20, 2007, students joined civil rights organizations and leaders in a collective effort to demand justice for the Jena 6. The six high school students were arrested and charged with the beating of a white student after harsh words were passed between two groups of students at a social function. This incident stemmed from the already heightened tensions at a school that was extremely segregated. Due to this, African-American students decided to protest in front of a tree that was reserved for whites. Days after the protest, the students were baffled to find three nooses painted in the school's colors hanging from the said tree. The tree referred to as the "white tree," has since been cut down. Robert Bailey Jr., Mychal Bell, Carwin Jones, Bryant Purvis and Theo Shaw were charged with aggravated assault and Jesse Ray Beard was charged as juvenile because he was only 14. Bell, who was in jail, has since been freed on bail and the others were charged as juveniles. The Reverend Al Sharpton, who spoke at the rally, said, "We as blacks must not stand for such injustice to happen. It is important that we be our brother's keeper and make sure that we are never racially profiled, wrongfully punished or mistreated by the US prison system."

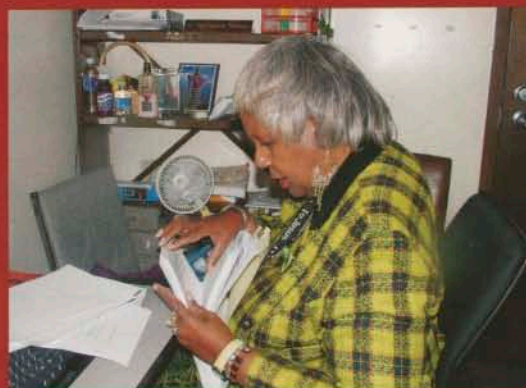

Dr. Georgianne Thomas received her Doctor of Arts in the Humanities from Clark Atlanta University, her Masters in Education from Georgia State University, and her Bachelor of Arts from Spelman College. Community activism, the arts and politics have all been large components of Dr. Thomas' life. Currently a Professor at Clark Atlanta University, Dr. Thomas has worked with the City of Atlanta Municipal Court as a program manager assisting victims of domestic violence, as a trainer with the Atlanta City Hall, as a trainer with Delta Airlines, and as an instructor in the Atlanta Public Schools.



She is founding chair of the Atlanta-Cotonou (Benin) Sister City Committee and served as the attaché for the Republic of Benin during the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta. Dr. Thomas has served as a Georgia delegate to the National Summit on Africa; was former president of the Atlanta Chapter of the National Association of Media Women; and was a pioneer member of the Atlanta Association of Black journalists.



In her political life, Dr. Thomas has been a candidate for the Atlanta City Council and for Georgia State Senate. She was elected to the Fulton County Democratic Party in 2002. Dr. Thomas is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., and is the proud mother of Rev. Alvelyn J. Sanders who herself is an artist and career professional of considerable note.



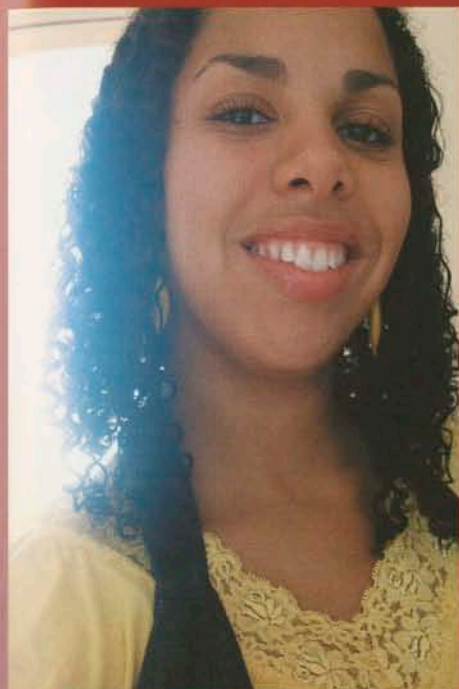
A seasoned actress, Dr. Thomas was the lead character in *365 Days*, a Plays by Pulitzer prize winner, Suzan-Lori Parks. She is an interview coach for various artists, filmed a 2005 pilot for Rowdy Films, is a writer, producer, director of television specials, teaches acting classes, has been a cable talk show host, and has been a radio announcer for WCLK Atlanta.

To finish graduate school, become a practicing physician and researcher



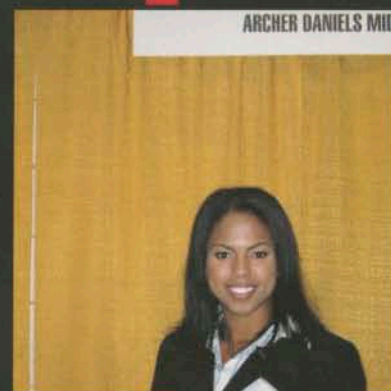
GRADUATE SCHOOL FAIR

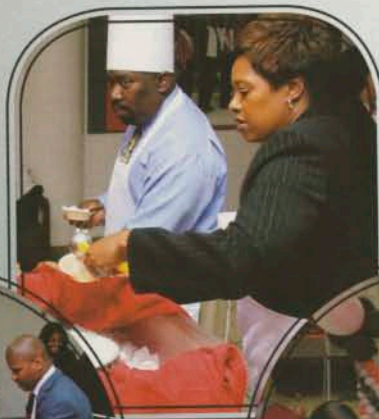

CARLTON E. BROWN

Dr. Brown brings to Clark Atlanta University a great wealth of executive experience and accomplishments in higher education, after having served as the president of Savannah State University (SSU) for nine and a half years and holding senior-level administrative positions at several universities. Before coming to CAU, Dr. Brown was appointed by Georgia Board of Regents Chancellor Errol Davis to assist in the implementation of major system-wide initiatives. A native of Macon, GA, Dr. Brown received both his Bachelor of Arts degree and his Doctorate from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst. He earned his Doctorate in multicultural education in 1979, and his bachelor's degree in English and American Studies in 1971. After completing his undergraduate degree, Dr. Brown worked as a teacher and counselor in an inner-city alternative high school. Dr. Brown served on the faculty of the School of Education at Old Dominion University in Virginia from 1979 to 1987. He then joined the faculty of Hampton University in Virginia as the dean of the School of Education, and later, as dean of the School of Liberal Arts and Education. In 1996, he was promoted to vice president for planning and dean of the Graduate College.

During his tenure as SSU's 11th president, the university experienced several notable milestones. Among them were: an increase in student enrollment of 48 percent from fall 1998 to fall 2005, the transformation of student housing and academic support facilities; the accreditation and reaccreditation of several academic programs; major increases in grants and contracts; improved student retention; and strengthened graduate programs to increase the number of minorities pursuing graduate degrees in science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

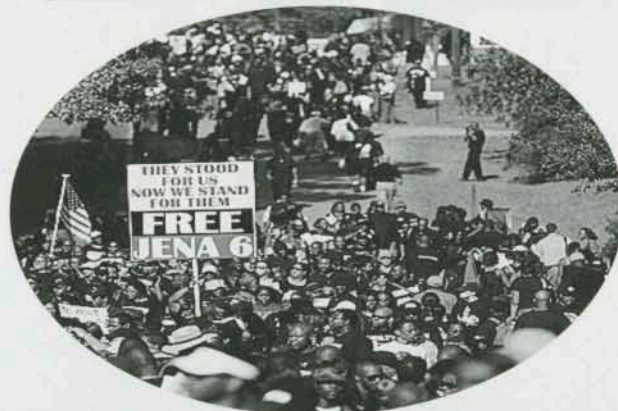


Presidential Debates

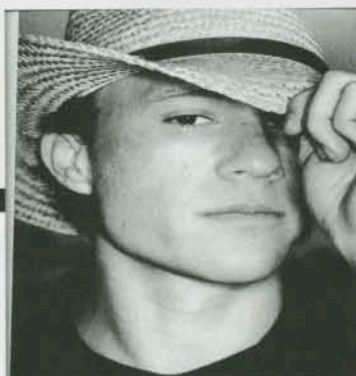
Oprah Winfrey Opening Own Television Network

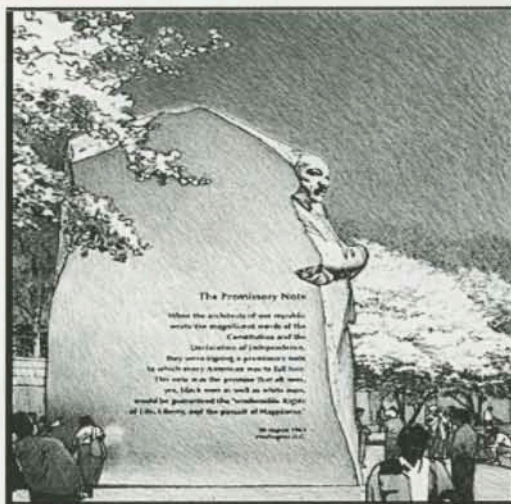


Marrion Jones Stripped of Olympic Medals

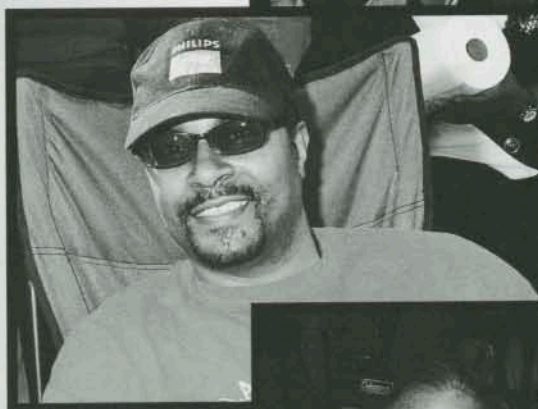

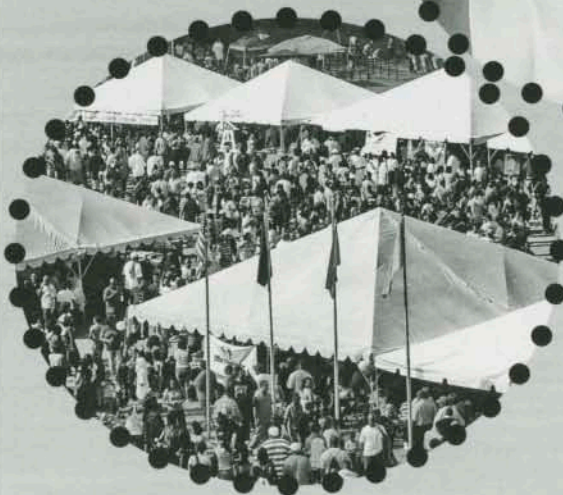


Albert H. Watts Alumni House

Farewell To Brawley

Completed in January 1959, Brawley Hall was named in honor of Dr. James P. Brawley, who became a member of the Clark University faculty in September of 1925; Dean of the College in 1926, and President in 1941. Dr. Brawley retired from the Presidency in 1965 after spending forty years at Clark; sixteen of which he served as a teacher and dean, and twenty-four as President. Brawley was built to meet Clark College's plans to increase male enrollment; Brawley Hall housed 224 students in 1963, and had accommodations for four male faculty members and four apartments for faculty members and their families. It was designated as a residence for junior and senior men, and for honor sophomores.

On the evening of Friday, November 17, 1911, three Howard University undergraduate students, with the assistance of their faculty advisor, gave birth to Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. This event occurred in the office of the biology professor Ernest E. Just, the faculty advisor. The three liberal arts students were Edgar A. Love, Oscar J. Cooper, and Frank Coleman. From the initials of the Greek phrase meaning “Friendship is Essential to the Soul,” the name Omega Psi Phi Fraternity was derived. Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance, and Uplift were adopted as the cardinal principles. Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., is an organizational brotherhood consisting of 750 chapters around the world. Beta Psi Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., was founded on December 22, 1923, at Clark University. Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., was the first Greek letter organization on the campus of Clark University, and is the first black fraternity to be founded at an HBCU (historically black college and universities).

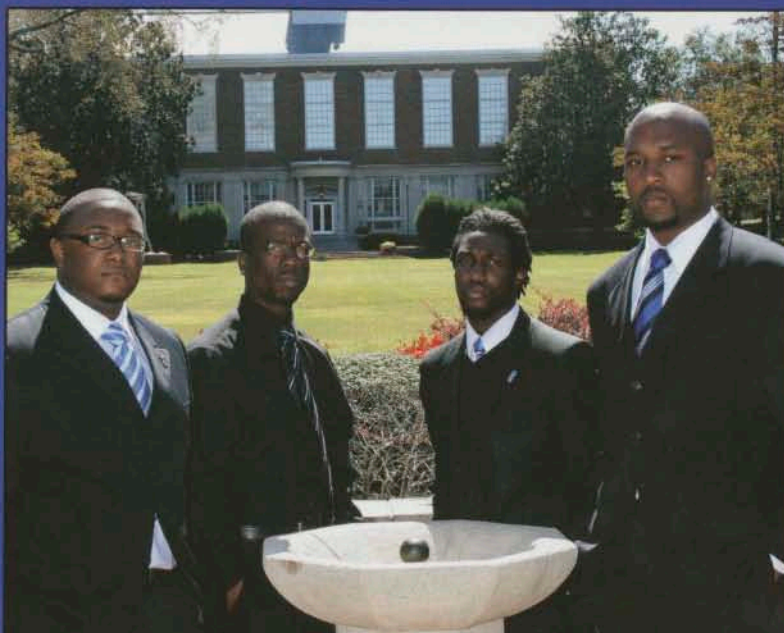

On January 16, 1920, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, was founded on the campus of Howard University by five illustrious women, Arizona C. Stemmons, Myrtle T. Faithful, Viola T. Goings, Fannie P. Watts, Pearl A. Neal. These women dared to be different and instead of joining the traditional coalitions for African-American women, they opted to start their own organization based upon the ideals of Scholarship, Service, Sisterly Love, and Finer Womanhood. Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., has accumulated a number of firsts throughout its rich history. Zeta Phi Beta was the first organization to become constitutionally bound to a fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated. Psi chapter was first established on the campus of Clark College in 1931 and then on the campus of Clark Atlanta University in 1988. Psi chapter has earned academic recognition for highest chapter and individual GPA on the Regional and State levels.

On January 9, 1914, Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, Inc., was formed at Howard University by three young African-American male students: the Honorable A. Langston Taylor, the Honorable Leonard F. Morse, and Charles I. Brown. These young men wanted to organize a Greek Letter Fraternity that would truly exemplify the ideals of Brotherhood, Scholarship, and Service. They believed that each potential member should be judged on his own merits, rather than his family background, or affluence. From the beginning, the founders also conceived Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., as a mechanism to deliver service to the general community. The Mighty Psi Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., was founded on December 27, 1935 at Clark University by the Honorable Brothers Rev. John Amy and Archie Berry Hill. The Psi Chapter remains after 72 years as a prominent chapter that continues to uplift the vision set forth by its founders.

Kappa Alpha Psi was founded on the campus of Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana, on January 5, 1911. Early in this century, when African-American students were actively dissuaded from attending college. Formidable obstacles were erected to prevent the few who were enrolled from assimilating into co-curricular campus life. This ostracism characterized Indiana University in 1911, thus causing Elder Watson Diggs, Byron K. Armstrong, John Milton Lee, Guy Levis Grant, Ezra D. Alexander, Henry T. Asher, Marcus P. Blakemore, Paul W. Caine, Edward G. Irvin, and George W. Edmonds to form Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. Fashioning achievement as its purpose, Kappa Alpha Psi began uniting college men of culture, patriotism, and honor.

Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. was organized on November 12, 1922 in Indianapolis, Indiana by seven young educators: Mary Lou Allison Little, Dorothy Hanley Whiteside, Vivian White Marbury, Nannie Mae Gahn Johnson, Hattie Mae Dulin Redford, Bessie M. Downey Martin and Rubena McClure. The group became an incorporated national collegiate sorority on December 30, 1929, when a charter was granted to Alpha chaptered at Butler University. Soaring To Greater Heights Of Attainment Around The World, Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc., as a leading national service organization, has met the challenges of the day and continues to grow through Sisterhood, Scholarship and Service. Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority's aim is to enhance the quality of life within the community. Public service, leadership development and education of youth are the hallmark of the organization's programs and activities. Sigma Gamma Rho addresses concerns that impact society educationally, civically, and economically.





National Pan-Hellenic Council



The National Pan-Hellenic Council, Incorporated (NPHC), is currently composed of nine (9) International Greek letter Sororities and Fraternities: Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Inc., Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc., Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. NPHC promotes interaction through forums, meetings and other mediums for the exchange of information and engages in cooperative programming and initiatives through various activities and functions.

On May 10, 1930, on the campus of Howard University, in Washington, DC, the National Pan-Hellenic Council was formed as a permanent organization with the following charter members: Omega Psi Phi and Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternities, and Alpha Kappa Alpha, Delta Sigma Theta and Zeta Phi Beta Sororities. In 1931, Alpha Phi Alpha and Phi Beta Sigma Fraternities joined the Council. Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority joined in 1937 and Iota Phi Theta Fraternity completed the list of member organizations in 1997.

The stated purpose and mission of the organization in 1930 was "Unanimity of thought and action as far as possible in the conduct of Greek letter collegiate fraternities and sororities, and to consider problems of mutual interest to its member organizations." Early in 1937, the organization was incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois and became known as "The National Pan-Hellenic Council, Incorporated."
