
On June 24, 1988, the Boards of Atlanta University and Clark College made the historic decision to consolidate the two institutions. creating Clark Atlanta University. The consolidated university was created on July 1, 1988. The new and historic University inherits the rich traditions of two independent institutions, connected over the years by a common heritage and commitment; by personal, corporate and consortia relationships; and by location. Atlanta University and Clark College through consolidation preserved the best of the past and present and "Charted a Bold New Future." It offers undergraduate, graduate, and professional degrees as well as certificate programs to students of diverse racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic backgrounds. The first President of Clark Atlanta University was Dr. Thomas W. Cole, Jr., who served concurrently as the President of both Atlanta University and Clark College prior to consolidation. Dr. Walter D. Broadnax became the second President for Clark Atlanta University on August 1, 2002. Starting our 20th anniversary, Clark Atlanta University welcomes Dr. Carlton E. Brown as its the third president. The University offers 38 major areas of study through four schools - Arts and Sciences; Business Administration; Education; and Social Work, and awards Bachelor's, Master's, Specialist, and Doctoral degrees.












Clark Atlanta University's opening convocation was held on Tuesday, September 23, 2008, in Leonidas S. Epps Gymnasium. Celebrating 20 years of academic excellence, this year's theme was "Achieving Greatness-Honoring Our History and Preparing for the Future. " Presiding over the occasion was Dr. Winfred Harris, a Howard W. Hughes Professor of Biological Science-Clark Atlanta University. 
2009 PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION




CAU Ambassadors can be seen daily conducting college tours to prospective students, families and friends.


The Student Radio Project along with WSTU Radio was developed to provide a training vehicle for communication students at Clark Atlanta University and in the Atlanta University Center.

Alpha Phi Alpha is the first intercollegiate fraternity established by African Americans. Founded on December 4, 1906, on the campus of Corne University in Ithaca, New York, as a social fraternity, Alpha Phi Alpha has initiated over 175,000 men into the organization and has been open to me of all races since 1940. The fraternity utilizes motifs and artifacts from Ancient Egypt to represent the organization and preserves its archives at the Moorland-Spingarn Research Center. The founders, Henry A. Callis, Charles H. Chapman, Eugene K. Jones, George B. Kelley, Nathaniel A. Murra, Robert H. Ogle, and Vertner W. Tandy, are collectively known as the "Seven Jewels," The fraternity expanded when a second chapter was chartered a Howard University in 1907. Beginning in 1908, Alpha Phi Alpha became the prototype for other Black Greek Letter Organizations (BGLO). Today, there are over 680 active Alpha chapters in the Americas, Africa, Europe, Asia, the West Indies, and the Virgin Islands.

The Alpha Phi chapter has received the "Chapter of the Year" award seven plus times and recently became the National Alpha Phi Alpha Step teat Champions for the second year in a row and The National Scholar bowl Champions. The Alpha Phi Chapter is currently very active on the campus of Clark Atlanta University and has received awards such as Most Prestigious Fraternity (2007), Best Week Ever AUC (2007), and the Extra Mile Community Service Award. The brothers of the Alpha Phi chapter make every effort every day to uphold the aims and motto of the fraternity and will continue to hold high the name.

In January 15, 1908, on the Campus of Howard University, Ethel Hedgeman Lyle along with 15 other visionary women, founded Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., making it the oldest and most eminent Greek-letter organization established in America for and by black college women. The perpetuity of this GREATNESS was secured on January 29, 1913, by a movement for incorporation led by Nellie Quander. Alpha Kappa Alpha cultivates and encourages high scholastic and ethical standards; promotes unity and friendship among college women; alleviates problems concerning girls and women; maintains a progressive interest in college life; and serves all mankind through a nucleus of more than 140,000 women in over 860 chapters.

Decades later, Alpha Kappa Alpha continued to expand and on May 21, 1930, Alpha Pi was chartered at Clark College in Merner Hall. Thirteen women with a vision of global service continued to uphold the purposes of Alpha Kappa Alpha and a 78- year legacy still remains strong.







On Friday, January 16, 1920 Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., was founded on the campus of Howard University in Washington, D.C., by five illustrious women: Arizona C. Stemmons, Myrtle T. Faithful, Viola T. Goings, and Pearl A. Neal. These women dared to be different and instead of joining the traditional coalitions for African-American women, opted to start upon the ideals of Scholarship, Service, Sisterly Love, and most of all Finer Womanhood. A constantly progressive organization, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. has accumulated a number of firsts throughout its rich history. Zeta Phi Beta was the first organization to establish international membership, to form adult and youth auxiliary groups, and to become constitutionally bound to a fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.

Psi Chapter was first established on the campus of Clark College in 1931 and chartered on CAU's campus in 1988. It is the 23rd undergraduate collegiate chapter of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. 






Kappa Alpha Psi is the second-oldest collegiate Greek-letter fraternity with a predominantly African American membership and the first black intercollegiate fraternity incorporated as a national body. Since the fraternity's founding in 1911 at Indiana University Bloomington, the fraternity has never limited membership based on color, creed or national origin. The fraternity is the first predominantly African American Greek-letter society founded west of the Appalachian Mountains still in existence, and is known for its "cane stepping" in NPHC organized step shows. Founders: Elder Watson Diggs, Byron Kenneth Armstrong, Ezra Dee Alexander, Henry Turner Asher, Marcus Peter Blakemore, Paul Waymond Caine, George Wesley Edmonds, Guy Levis Grant, Edward Giles Irvin, and John Milton Lee.

On November 23, 1948, on the campus of what was then known as Clark College, the charter for one of the most dynamic, most illustrious, most compelling, and the GREATEST CHAPTER of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. was legitimated...THE GAMMA KAPPA CHAPTER! 

Digma Gamma Rho was founded on November 12, 1922, by seven educators in Indianapolis, Indiana. The group became an incorporated national collegiate sorority on December 30,1929, when a charter was granted to Alpha chapter at Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana. The sorority is a nonprofit whose aim is to enhance the quality of life within the community. Public service, leadership development and the education of youth are the hallmarks of the organization's programs and activities. Founded in the midst of segregation, Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority is the only sorority of the four historically African-American sororities which comprise the National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC), to be established at a predominantly white campus. Founders: Mary Lou Allison Gardner Little, Nannie Mae Gahn Johnson, Vivian White Marbury, Bessie Mae Downey Rhoades Martin, Cubena McClure, Hattie Mae Annette Dulin Redford, and Dorothy Hanley Whiteside. Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, has over 90,000 members with more than 500 undergraduate and alumnae chapters throughout the United States, Bermuda, the Bahamas, Africa and Korea.

The Phi Chapter at Clark Atlanta University was chartered in 1934. In May 1950, the chapter was reactivated by eighteen ladies initiated into the Aurora Club. In Fall 1951, five members were initiated. They are Dorothy Hunter, Rosa Hart, Mary McNear, Pearlie Robinson and Earlene Walker.


The National Pan-Hellenic Council, Incorporated (NPHC) is composed of nine (9) International Greek letter Sororities and Fraternities: Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Inc., Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc., Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. NPHC promotes interaction through forums, meetings and other mediums for the exchange of information and engages in cooperative programming and initiatives through various activities and functions.

On May 10, 1930, on the campus of Howard University, in Washington, DC, the National Pan-Hellenic Council was formed as a permanent organization with the following charter members: Omega Psi Phi and Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternities, and Alpha Kappa Alpha, Delta Sigma Theta and Zeta Phi Beta Sororities. In 1931, Alpha Phi Alpha and Phi Beta Sigma Fraternities joined the Council. Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority joined in 1937, and Iota Phi Theta Fraternity completed the list of member organizations in 1997.

The stated purpose and mission of the organization in 1930 was "Unanimity of thought and action as far as possible in the conduct of Greek letter collegiate fraternities and sororities, and to consider problems of mutual interest to its member organizations." Early in 1937, the organization was incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois and became known as "The National Pan-Hellenic Council, Incorporated."








Dell mania



"After every football game, the football team would meet at the Quadrangle and sing the school anthem--win or lose. Freshmen were also called "crabs" until they finally collected their first semester hours on their transcript." Prof. Harrington is currently the Undergraduate Lab Coordinator for the Physics Department and CAU, and still teaches Physics labs. "Do not entertain the thought of quitting school as a solution to a problem.'


It Would Not Have Been Possible Mr Devin White







