Park. They don't have extreme frictions or disturbances.

Remarks:

There are five or six very good - well kept, neat, good building, churches for Negroes in C.P. The ministers are said to be uncooperative, and unprogressive-minded, toward community life. - The city donated \$100.00 toward the Butler Street YMCA Campaign last year (51). - College Park's motto is, "a city of homes" - The Candler air port is located in C.P., also the Georgia Military Academy.
