The ALL-CITIZEN REGISTRATION COMMITTEE is asking you to continue your fine cooperation relative to the Registration Campaign. Please remind your members and friends that May 4, 1946 is the DEADLINE for Registration.

Ask each member to take the responsibility upon themselves to contact ten individuals in their neighborhood who have not Registered and urge them to go to the COURT HOUSE on Pryor Street and Register before the Books Close. Kindly place Special Emphasis on this matter at each Service or Meeting held at your Church.

Our minimum Goal is to get 25,000 Negroes Registered on the books by May 4, 1946.

MEMO

TO: All Courthouse Workers
FROM: All-Citizens Registration Committee

RE: Instructions

PURPOSE: "To encourage all adult Negroes to register to vote while they are visiting the courthouse on business"

1. Dress neatly, not flashy.
2. Go to the Fulton County Courthouse, 165 Central Avenue, S. W. at 9:00 A.M. for morning duty and at 2:00 P.M. for afternoon duty. Lunch time is from 1:00 P.M. to 2:00 P.M. Report on time.
3. Report to Mrs. Jacqueline Green. She is the supervisor in charge of the courthouse volunteers. She will give you instructions and assign you a station.
4. Make your initial approach with a smile.
5. Courtesy must be your by-word.
6. You are not a salesman - just ask your prospect if you may show him or her where prospective voters may register.
7. The prospect should not be touched. (Keep your hands to yourself.)
8. Concern yourself only with your particular assignment - asking people to register.
9. Do not be drawn into any controversy or argument about anything. Your job is to encourage - not force - people to register. You are not trying to win a debate.
10. Answer no questions about the results of your work. Refer all inquiries from any stranger to some courthouse official.
11. Do not crowd or block the hallways.
12. Do not talk loud.
13. In case you have a question about anything, contact your supervisor, Mrs. Green.
14. Remember: Be courteous - use decorum - smile - smile - smile! !
