furniture from being placed on streets and sidewalks (passed the Senate 43-0; passed the House of Represen-tatives 166-2, opposed by the Attorney General and not signed by the Gover-nor)

5. A bill making it easier for persons without schooling to register and vote. Senator Johnson led the struggle for improvement for all citizens.

1. The fight to desegregate the State Capitol.

2. The fight to desegregate the Drivers License Bureau.

3. The fight for the passage of the mixed drinks referendum.

4. The fight for greater pension benefits for firemen, policemen, and teachers in Fulton County.

Senator Johnson appointed for the first time in Georgia's history 80 Negro boys and girls to serve as pages in the State Capitol.

Senator Johnson voted for progressive legislation in Housing, Education, Health and Welfare for the benefit of all citizens.

The following legislation for the benefit of the people of the 38th District, Fulton County and the State of Georgia:

1. Four attempts to make Public Accommodation Laws illegal in the new State Constitution.

2. Attempts to pass an anti-picketing bill designed to prevent demonstrations in Georgia.

3. Prevented three attempts to write into the new proposed Constitution a provision requiring segregation in education.
