## The Johnson Record

Senator Leroy Johnson has represented with distinction the people of the 38th District, Fulton County and the State of Georgia during the last two years in the Georgia Senate. He has:

**SERVED:** The people of the 38th District and his state as a member of the following standing Legislative Committees:

1. Appropriation Committee
2. Health and Welfare Committee
3. Judiciary Committee
4. Educational Matters Committee

**SERVED:** The people of the 38th District and his state as a member of the following Temporary Legislative Committees:

1. Rapid Transit Committee
2. Small Loan Study Committee
3. State-wide Teacher Tenure Committee

**INTRODUCED:** The following legislation for the benefit of the people in the 38th District, Fulton County and the State of Georgia:

1. A Public Accommodations Bill (Before the National Civil Rights Bill passed)
2. A minimum wage law of \$1.00 per hour for all workers in the State of Georgia.
3. A State-wide Teacher Tenure Law to protect the jobs of all teachers in Georgia.
4. A slum clearing bill, requiring property to be brought up to standards.

**PASSED:** The following legislation for the benefit of the people of the 38th District, Fulton County and the State of Georgia:

1. An Anti-Poll Tax Resolution through the State Senate.
2. A bill requiring an election to be held to fill vacancies on the Board of Aldermen for the city of Atlanta.
3. A revenue measure which would provide some \$40,000 to the County Treasurer to increase services with no increase of taxes.
4. An Anti-Dispossessory Bill to prevent

furniture from being placed on streets and sidewalks (passed the Senate 43-0; passed the House of Representatives 166-2, opposed by the Attorney General and not signed by the Governor).

5. A bill making it easier for persons without schooling to register and vote.

**LED:** Senator Johnson led the struggle for improvement for all citizens.

1. The fight to desegregate the State Capitol.
2. The fight to desegregate the Drivers License Bureau.
3. The fight for the passage of the mixed drinks referendum.
4. The fight for greater pension benefits for firemen, policemen, and teachers in Fulton County.

**APPOINTED:** Senator Johnson appointed for the first time in Georgia's history 80 Negro boys and girls to serve as pages in the State Capitol.

**VOTED:** Senator Johnson voted for progressive legislation in Housing, Education, Health and Welfare for the benefit of all citizens.

**DEFEATED:** The following legislation for the benefit of the people of the 38th District, Fulton County and the State of Georgia:

1. Four attempts to make Public Accommodation Laws illegal in the new State Constitution.
2. Attempts to pass an anti-picketing bill designed to prevent demonstrations in Georgia.
3. Prevented three attempts to write into the new proposed Constitution a provision requiring segregation in education.

**SERVED:** As a member of the State Democratic Executive Committee and on the National Community Service Committee to implement the Civil Rights Bill. Appointed by President Lyndon Johnson to serve as special Ambassador to represent the United States at the Independence Celebration in Zanzibar, Africa.
