Dear Millicent:

I thank you for your letter in which you express a desire to acquire one of my paintings. I have given some thought to your idea of my doing something based on the "Unmistaken Memory" featuring, perhaps, Cingis. With this in mind, may I propose the following: That I do a sketch of the suggested painting in the style, manner, and subject interpretation according to my usual approach. I would then have a slide made of the sketch and send this to you for your approval (or disapproval.) If you are in agreement, the painting would be executed similar to the sketch, which would serve as a model.

As to the dimensions of the painting, I would suggest a size somewhere about 40" x 50", not including the frame. The frame would be kept to a minimum, yet appropriate in all respects. I would be willing to offer you the
