A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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An Act To provide that any plan adopted by the Georgia Department of Public Health pursuant to the provisions of Title XIX of the Federal Social Security Act, Pub. L. 89-97, Title I, Section 121 (a), 79 Stat. 343, and any future plan adopted by said Department, pursuant to said statutory authority, shall, in the case of presently adopted plans, be amended to provide that the provisions for medical assistance contained therein shall include medical assistance rendered by chiropractors; to provide that any future plans adopted by said Department, pursuant to said statutory authority shall include medical assistance rendered by chiropractors; to provide definitions; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

Section 1. Any plan adopted by the Georgia Department of Public Health pursuant to the provisions of Title XIX of the Federal Social Security Act, Pub. L. 89-97, Title I, Section 121 (a), 79 Stat. 343, and any future plan adopted by said Department, pursuant to said statutory authority, shall, in the case of presently adopted plans, be amended to provide that the provisions for medical assistance contained therein shall include medical assistance rendered by chiropractors, and shall, in the case of any future such plan or plans, include in the provisions for medical assistance contained therein, medical assistance rendered by chiropractors.

Section 2. The term "chiropractors" as used in Section 1 means persons licensed to practice chiropractic pursuant to the provisions of Ga. Code Chapter 84-5, as

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amended.

Section 3. Nothing in this Act shall be construed as enlarging the scope of practice of chiropractors, as provided in Ga. Code 84-5, as amended.

Section 4. The provisions of this Act shall become effective immediately upon its approval by the Governor or its otherwise becoming law.

Section 5. All laws or parts of law in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.
