### SELECTIVE BUYING CAMPAIGN

Each day we learn that the students of various schools are boycotting chain stores throughout the South which maintain segregation at lunch counters.

Many of the schools in the North, East, and Western part of the United States are marching in sympathy and carrying the boycott in their section of the states. Both Negro and White students are joining in the fight with the Southern students.

Up until this date no organized protest has been presented to the students of the University Center. Nevertheless, you can expect a campaign to be opened up in the near future. We hold that the students will offer strong and sincere cooperation. Watch and wait for the signal.

### CORRESPONDANCE

A letter serves so many purposes. It can bring joy or sorrow. It can encourage one or turn his thoughts to defeat.
