A motion was made and carried that we meet on the third Fridays of each month.

A motion was made that the dues be 10 cts instead of 5 cts.

This motion was carried with the amendment, that when a reasonable amount was realized it be devoted to some charitable cause.

Constitution
of
The Bohatanga Circle - Adopted, Nov. 25, 1917

Article I

This organization shall be known as
The Bohatanga Circle.

Article II

Sec. 1. This club shall consist of fifteen ladies.

Sec. 2. Vacancies shall be filled as they occur.

Sec. 3. Any lady wishing to sever her connection with the circle shall do so by sending in a written resignation.

Sec. 4. New members shall be elected by ballot.

Article III.

The officers of this circle shall consist of chairman, secretary and treasurer.

Article IV

It shall be the duty of the chairman to preside at the meetings, and in case of her absence a temporary chairman shall be selected.

The secretary shall keep a complete record of all meetings.

Article V.

The officers of the circle shall be elected by ballot annually, and no officer shall hold office longer than two consecutive terms.

Article VI

This constitution may be amended by $\frac{2}{3}$ votes of the circle.

Amendment.

Any member absent more than three consecutive meetings, without a lawful excuse, will forfeit ^{the} their membership.

Article V.

The officers of the circle shall be elected by ballot annually, and no officer shall hold office longer than two consecutive terms.

Article VI

This constitution may be amended by $\frac{2}{3}$ votes of the circle.

Amendment.

Any member absent more than three consecutive meetings, without a lawful excuse, will forfeit ^{the} their membership.
