# Bishop Morris Brown

Bishop Morris Brown, by Bishop D.A. Payne

Morris Brown was born in Charleston, 5.C., in 1770. His parentage is not known, He was of light brown complexion, and was about six feet high, well proportioned with a slight fendency to corpulency. His head was large, his eyes, clear and expressive, shone from beneath shoggy eye brows. According to the general theory that bulk as well as brain is a necessary condition of effectiveness in the case of the best marble, if not quarried, squared, and polished, its fine color and beautiful vein will forever be hidden; so, also, with men, if education does not perform her developing functions upon him, his talents, although angelic, will never exhibit their beautiful hues an elegant proportions.

Morris Brown was born and grew up to mature years in the days of South Carolina slavery. Some schools there were, but not for black men. Some teachers, also, there were, but not far colored children. Up to 1835 and later, the free colored people of South Carolina were excluded from schools in which children were rought. Somewhere about 1808 or 1809 a white Methodist local preacher by the name of Thomas S. Bonneau, opened private schools for colored children; but at that date Morris Brown was about thirty-eight years old, with a growing family on his hands. The apostolic Asbury knew Brown. He also knew slavery very well; hence his deep sympathy with the blacks, of whom he made so many memoranda in his journal, and in whose behalf he induced the General Conference of 1800 to memorialize the General Assembly of South Carolina. More than once, while some of his preachers were enjoying themselves in the parlors with masters and household, he went into the kitchen to comfort and instruct the slaves. Morris Brown did learn to read the Bible, but when and by whom he was taught we cannot now ascertain. Probably he was taught as were a few free colored people and a few slaves, by some white person, who was paid for his trouble with baked sweet potatoes. Like Bishop Allen he was unable to write his own official letters; hence he always employed an amanuensis. The writer of this sketch frequently enjoyed the happiness and honor of conducting the Episcopal correspondence of the latter.























#### M.B.C. Wolverines 1984 Season Outlook

With 15 of 22 starters returning (9-offense, 6-defense), Head Coach Greg Thompson still realizes he is in a rebuilding process. The 1983 team was relatively young and not deep at the skilled positions. With a year of experience, these young men should mold into a challenging unit.

Heading the list of returnees on offense will be Leonard Camel, a 5'10" Junior quarter-back who threw for 1451 yards and 10 touchdowns; Leon Winfrey, 5'11", a Senior tailback who rushed for 678 yards and five TD's, plus catching 20 passes for 169 yards and 2 TD's. Winfrey also had 9 returns for 81 yards.


On defense, the Wolverines will be led by Todd Wilcher, 6', a Senior linebacker who led the team in total tackles with 106; Kevin Gibbs, 6'2", a Senior nose guard who had 99 tackles and 4 quarterback sacks and James Liverpool, 6'1/2", a sophomore linebacker who as a freshman had 86 tackles and 4 quarterback sacks. The Wolverines' record-setting return man will be back: Victor Scott, 5'9", a Junior (wide receiver) returned kickoffs of 98 yards (school record) and 95 yards for TD's last season. He returned 26 kickoffs for 564 yards, a 21.7 average per return.

This year's crop of newcomers could very well add depth at the skilled positions. After an embarrassing opening day loss, the Morris Brown College Wolverines have come bock to play football like a team possessed. Losing 43-7 to Livingston (Ala.) College on September 1 made Wolverine fors wonder what this season was going to be like, but head coach Greg Thompson attributed the loss to mistake-prone football. "It was a game in which we made too many mistokes against a well coached team. They came into the game ranked as one of the top Division lik-A football teams in the country. Our offense allowed our defense to stay on the field too long."

The offense could only muster a fourth quarrer touchdown and the defense showed fortigue and a lock of the fundamentals that have been the trademark of the hard-hitting Wolverine defense. Sloppy tockling was the order of the day as the Livingston offense compiled 376 total yards. attempts for 80 yards, one TD and one interception.




In the third quarter neither offense could get a drive going. Leonard Camel dropped back and threw a swing pass to Victor Scott for a 59 yard touchdown. The extra point was missed and M.B.C. had to settle for a 9-7 lead as the third quarter ended.

The fourth quarter saw very little offense and a lot of hard hitting defense. The Rams took the lead back 31 yard field goal. That made the score 10-9 in favor of the Rams. This was one loss that hurt the Wolverines' chances for the S.I.A.C. title.

Leonard Camel completed 14 passes on 33 attempts for 214 yards and one touchdown, but the bad part was, he sacked four times. Leon Winfrey rushed for 68 yards on 24 attempts. Victor Scott lead all the receivers with three catches for 88 yards and one touchdown.

The defense was led by Chris Mainor with 14 tackles. Todd Wilcher and David Kinchen had nine a piece to complement Mainor's performance. Overall the whole defense played outstanding football.

M.B.C. now has a record of 4-3-1 overall and 4-1-1 in the conference.



Wolverines Defeat Bulldogs 28-24

With senior running back Leon Winfrey leading the way and the play of quarterback Leonard Camel, the fighting Wolverines turned back a stubborn Alabama A & M University team 28-24 at Herndon Stadium in front of partisan crowds.

The Wolverines got things going by scoring twice before the Bulldogs could get started. Winfrey went in from one yard out to score the Wolverines first score. Before the visitors could get their breath the Wolverines were in the end zone once more. At halftime the Wolverines were leading 14-10.

The third quarter started very slowly for both teams. Then Camel threw a 27 yard strike to Split End Victor Scott to put the Wolverines up 21-10.

However, the Bulldags would not break and came back to score on a punt return. That made the score 21-17 with the Wolverines still on top at the end of the third quarter.

In the fourth quarter the Bulldogs took the lead for the first time when they caught the Wolverines defense sleeping and scored a touchdown. That put them ahead 24-21 with about four minutes to play. Camel came back on the field to guide the Wolverines on a long drive which resulted in a seven yard game winning strike to wide receiver Paul Smith.

Camel completed 11 passes on 25 attempts for 1978 yards, two touchdowns, and one interception. Victor Scott led the way in the receiving department catching three passes for 93 yards and a touchdown. Paul Smith also caught two passes for nineteen yards and one touchdown.

The defense was led by Chris Mainor, David Kinchen, and Johnny Barksdale. Mainor had six solo tackles and 10 assists. Kinchen had 6 solos and 4 assists and one quarterback sock. Barksdale had a stellar performance with five solos, five assists one interception, and a fumble recovery.

The offense and defense played well and the Wolverines came out with a rough victory. They are now 4-0-1 in the SIAC Conference. The Wolverines will take a week off to prepare for their Homecoming tilt with Albany State on November 3rd. The Rams and Wolverines are both undefeated in Conference play and their November 3rd match could possibly decide the SIAC championship.



## Hawk Passes Wildcats Over Wolverines

On Saturday ofternoon, November 10, 1984, the Morris Brown College Wolverines took on the Wildcats of Bethune-Cookman College in Memorial Stadium before a Homecoming crowd of 10,200.

The Wildcats scored first when Bernard Hawk (B-CC's quarterback) hit Leon Gonzales for a 43 yard touchdown pass. The extra point was good and the Wildcats lead 7-0. The first quarter began the same way as the first with Hawk throwing to Sebastian Brown for a 10 yard touchdown strike. The extra point was good and B-CC had a quick 14-0 lead and then added another touchdown when Hawk hit Brown again, this time for 20 yards. The Wildcats held a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter.

Then in a span of 2:23, the Wolverines scored three TD's to get back in the football game. The Wolverines scored when Leonard Camel hit Phillip Johnson for an 11 yard TD pass, the extra point was missed. Then Winfrey scored from three yards out and then again when Camel hit him for a 13 yard strike. That tied the score at 21:21. But before the half ended Hawk hit Gonzalez for a 20 yard TD pass. The kick was missed and the half ended 27:21 in B-CC favor.

In the third quarter, Dexter Simon gave the Wolverines their first lead on a 60 yard interception for a TD. The kick was good and the Wolverines lead 28-27.

B-CC put the game in our reach on a King Green six yard TD run. That put the Wildcats up 35-28 at the end of three quarters.

In the fourth quarter the Wolverines could not get on track against a stubborn Wildcats defense. While in the fourth quarter, Hawk threw for another TD pass to Brown for 43 yards for the final points. The score ended 42-28 in favor of the Wildcats. Bernard Hawk completed 40 passes on 57 attempts for 491 yards and five touchdowns. Brown and Gonzales combined for 26 catches for 375 yards and five TD's. Leonard Camel completed 7 of 10 passes for 63 yards and two touchdowns, Leon Winfrey rushed for 76 yards on 23 carries. The defense was led by Chris Mainor with 17 tackles. The game had plenty of penalties. There was a total of 25 penalties for 306 yards. The Wolverines are now 4-4-1 overall and 4-1-1 in the S.I.A.C.


The next week M.B.C. beat Savannah State 75-70; Benedict 112-91; and Albany State College.


WOMEN'S BASKETBALL PREVIEW 1984-85 by Cecil Mckay

# Reverend Jackson Spends Birthday At M.B.C. Campaigns for Democrats.



The Rev. Jesse Jackson

On Monday, October 8th, Reverend Jesse Jackson told students attending a voter registration raily at Mortis Brown College that at one time the Atlanta University System was hubcop or headquarters of the movement for social and economic justice in our nation and peace in our world. "We transcended from our fraternity-ness, sorority-ness, Morehouse-ness, Spelman-ness, Mortis Brown-ness, and Atlanta University-ness, we didn't have time for fun and foolishness. Animosity didn't have any time in our lives as civilized people," he said.

Jackson urging students to vote said there were people marching from slavery to freedom, marching from disgrace to Amazing Grace, all of us cannot be famous he said, because all of us cannot be known. "Because of that generation that fought from dust, death, blood, swear and tears, that generations swear and socrifice, they ochieved greatness because they served their day," Jackson said. "You don't have to flight public accommodation, you don't have to march for the right to vote. They made our only obligation to register and vote in this election." Jackson said the entire country is at stake and in November we will be voting for the person we want to direct the country.

He also said on that day to vote your conscience. Unless we forget that Reagan chose the "nuclear race over the human race" and that he cut back on financial aid but continued to send funds to El Salvador. "On November 6, we have thousands of reasons to vote and no reason not to vote," he said. "We now have the power to reinforce our nation, everybody that has an opinion must put that opinion in the vote," said Jackson. "Your are not just voting on November 6 for a man, an idea, it's more than that at stake," he added.

He told the capacity crowd that we will be going on a shopping spree for four years, it's a political shopping game he sold.

"On that day the entire body of politics as well as the head is running and we have the power from the outhouse to the White House to make that judgment and we are going to do it."

Following his address, Jackson inspired 250 unregistered students to register and was also given an award by Morris Brown Student Government President David Kinchen.

October 8th was also a special day for the country preacher as he celebrated his 43rd birthday. Rev. Jackson commented that he like Dr. King was glod to be able to spend his birthday flighting for justice.
