COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER AND HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT William H. Cosby Doctor of Humane Letters

Bill Cosby was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Calling himself a "late bloomer," he did not realize the value of a formal education until after the first four days of boot camp in the United States Navy. Cosby said that four years later, immediately after he got out of the Navy, he "hit the ground running" from Norfolk, Virginia and immediately returned to his native home, Philadelphia, and enrolled at Temple University where he completed his undergraduate degree.

Cosby is well known for his commitment to education. He emphatically believes that the best assurance for a satisfying and rewarding life begins with knowledge. Several years after completing his bachelor's degree and long after he had achieved much of his success, Cosby returned to college to obtain his master's degree and his Ed.D.

In fact, Bill Cosby has never stopped realizing the importance of challenging himself. He believes that accepting the challenges of one's own ideas, clarifying the unanswered questions and pursuing the excitement of discovery is what life is all about.

Bill Cosby share his passion for education with his wife, Dr. Camille Cosby. Together they have strived to promote the importance of a good education. They have donated funds to a wide range of universities and they have delivered commencement addresses to further emphasize the importance of learning.






Founders Day 2001

There are many ways to celebrate a birthday. This year Morris Brown College marked its 120th anniversary with prayer, praise and promises.

The celebration, which included the opening of a community cyber center and the dedication of the new archives and museum of African-American history, culminated in an institution-wide convocation held at the John H. Lewis gymnasium Thursday, March 22.

Institutional and community greetings initiated a rousing succession of reverence to dear ole' Morris Brown and its founders headed by the Brownite family, college president Dr. Dolores E. Cross and Atlanta mayor Bill Campbell.

However, it was the celebration's dynamic keynote speaker, Rev. Dr. Floyd H. Flake that literally bought the gathering to its feet.





"Never think that what you receive at Morris Brown is inferior," he said in his pastor-like speech. "It's about your definition of yourself and where you're going with your life that counts."

Flake, who like Morris Brown College is very grounded in history, is the senior pastor of the 12,000-member Allen African Methodist Episcopal Church in Queens, N.Y. He also serves as president of the Edison charter schools and is a former U.S. representative.

He lent his voice and years of experience in the American mainstream to the

robed graduates and general student body present, and voiced the claim of a lost social paradigm. According to Flake, the notion a duality between being black and being second-class has been sidelined, and largely can no longer be sustained in the present social system.

"You're only second-class if you believe it," Flake said. "And believing such is an injustice to yourself and your struggles."

Flake prayed for the graduates and the institution's strength, and asked those gathered to call on the name of the Lord in all situations. He praised the vision of Morris Brown alongside that of other

Morris Brown College Honor

Golden Key National Honor Society

I olden Key National Honor So ciety is a nonprofit academic honors organizations founded for the purpose of recognizing and encouraging scholastic achievements among students from all academic fields. The Society was founded at Georgia State University on November 29, 1997. Morris Brown College was the first Historically Black College and University (HBCU) to join Golden Key and the second college to become a member of the Society. Since that time, Golden Key has established itself as a positive force in higher education. The Society has 214 active chapters from across the country and Australia.

In addition, over 500,000 lifetime members and 5,000 honorary members, have been induced. Golden Key is a dynamic organization committed to meeting the needs of scholastic achievers. Beta Beta Beta Biology Honor Society

eta Beta Beta formally defines it self as "an honor and professional society for students of the biological sciences." Its time of birth (1922) accounts for both its Greek letter name and its original emphasis on a role as an "honorary." However, it has never been a secret society and, from its beginning, many of its activities have been those of professional society. Since it is a society of and for students, particularly for undergraduate majors in a biological science, it is not inaccurate to describe it as a professional society for apprentice biologists. The constitutional restrictions, few though they be, and the activities of chapters, varied as they are, given the structural and functional basis for the claim to professional statue.

hi Sigma Iota was founded in 1922 at Allegheny College by Dr. Henry W. Church, member of his department of languages, and advanced students, who used to meet to discuss linguistic and literary matters. It became a national society when Beta Chapter was established at Pennsylvania State University in April 1925, followed less than a year after by Gamma Chapter at the college of Wooster. With these three Chapters as the nucleus of the national organization, the first Convention was held in May, 1926, at Alleghany College. Since that time expansion has been steady.

Psi Chi Psychology Honor Society

Psychology founded in 1929 for the pur poses of encouraging, stimulating, and maintaining excellence in scholarship, and advancing the science of psychology. Membership is open to graduate and undergraduate men and women ho are making the study of psychology one of their major interests and who meet the minimum qualifications. Psi Chi is a member of the Association of College Honor Societies and is an affiliate of the American Psychological Association (APA) and the American Psychological Society (APS). Psi Chi's sister honor society is Psi Beta, the national honor society in psychology for community and junior colleges.

Psi Chi functions as a federation of chapters located at more than 857 senior colleges and universities in the USA.

SIGMA GAMMA RHO SORORITY

Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. was organized by seven young women on the campus of Butler University, Indianapolis, Indiana on No. 12, 1922. Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority is a nonprofit collegiate organization with foci on community service. Its purpose is expressed in its slogan, "Greater Service, Greater Progress."

Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. gives leadership, service and resources toward removing barriers and inequalities so that all people, especially Black Community, may develop their potential and exercise full citizenship. Beta Lambda Chapter




A lpha Lambda Chi was founded on the campus of *Morris Brown College* on September 16, 1992 by 11 men determined to make a difference in the communities from which they came. Seeing the need for a great bond among *African American* males in particular, these eleven individuals decided to establish an organization that would unite in a fraternal bond, men for a purpose. This purpose was defined as the betterment of themselves and the surrounding communities through community service activities and to found, what would be the first, Community Service Fraternity in the Atlanta University Center. Inadvertently, Alpha Lambda Chi would also go on to become the first official Alpha Chapter greek letter organization on the campus of *Morris Brown College*. It was during this year that these 11 men went on to further define what kind of men/workers/ leaders they wanted to attract.

All of the planning of the previous year went into effect during the fall semester of 1993. Seven new members were brought into the organization already having deep convictions about their communities. It was known by these and all members, that neither the mission bestowed upon them nor the convictions indoctrinated in them by the founders of this fraternity did not begin nor will they end with *Alpha Lambda Chi*. They are the responsibilities of all males — especially black males who ever wish to call themselves Men. On the flipside of this con, it is also the responsibility of the women of our communities to unite and give back to them. Therefore, a few of the founders of *Alpha Lambda Chi* in conjunction with the new members established a sister organization known as Sapphires. Understand, it doesn't take greek letters to do what all Africans in America should do, but a united

front is an unconquerable one. Understand also, What has been accomplished by other greek letter organizations cannot be ignored, therefore we give honor to their unity through our existence.


As a non profit organization, Alpha Lambda Chi has done a great deal of work with the children in the Vine City area through the B.O.Y.S. program in accordance with the Catalyst program. Alpha Lambda Chi has also been involved with feeding the homeless, providing carnivals and entertainment for homeless children, providing tutorial services for local high schools, and elementary schools. We are also in the process of providing recycling bins on the yard of Morris Brown College's campus. Currently, Alpha Lambda Chi is in the process of establishing ties with other larger organizations in order to expand its reach. We have established ties with the Coca Cola Foundation, Kroger's, and have future plans to work with 100 Black Men of Atlanta, as well as Sisterlove, Volunteer Atlanta and many other volunteer help groups.



Farewell Remarks — Dr. Dolores Cross, The first female president of Morris Brown College

Dear Colleagues,

As I enter the fortieth month of my presidency I am very proud of what the Morris Brown College family has achieved in staying the course. We have worked hard to respond to 65SACs recommendations, implemented a wireless technology infrastructure and laptop initiative, and attracted over 8 million dollars in grants. We are at this time implementing a debt management plan and have developed a Blueprint for Action to respond to accreditation and department of education concerns. In a conversation with Ann Chara this morning she indicated support for our plan and suggested a SACs consultant to see us through. The visiting team will be coming to campus October 23, 24, and 25 to review our fiscal operation and final audit.

In other conversations this week with the Department of Education, they have agreed to as early as next week to discuss an alternative to reimbursement. We are sending information today to respond to concerns. As you also know, we are pleased that Ms. Margara Black has joined the team as the new Director of Financial Aid. Unfortunately, she won't be fully on board until early March, but does come to campus every week. She is working already in assisting the development of a corrective plan for financial aid. Parvesh Single leaves his post at the end of this month and is working now on responding to DOE audit. from previous years.

The team in fiscal affairs is focused and moving forward. Key to our success is the time they must take in Banner training. In essence SACS will test the system, review our mosrecent audit and review our response to the corrective plan for financial aid. We have satisfied the one academic related recommendation for Accounting Professor with a Ph.D We have also made major strides in improving our net assets through grants.

Key is the ability of Morris Brown College to hold on, to press on, and to appreciate the reality that your personal and professional struggles have not been in vain. You can do this. In my heart of hearts I feel the regulatory agencies want us to succeed. I implore you not to be turned around. We have come too far. You have my respect and remain in m prayers.

Finally, I have no illusions that I have been a perfect president, but I am proud of doin, a personal best on a difficult course. And I have not done it alone. In the spirit of th African 'we' tradition ... each of us is moving ahead ... using individual means to lik ends. The force stay with us and God bless.



During the fall of 1952, Dean Willie Frank Payne traveled to Stanton High School in Jacksonville, Florida and recruited four young ladies to attend Morris Brown College. Three of those ladies were high stepping majorettes for the Stanton High School Marching Blue Devils band. One of those ladies was Deloris Harris. In the fall of 1952, she boarded a train from the Old Union Station in Jacksonville and journeyed to Atlanta to attend school on a band scholarship and participate as a Majorette for the Morris Brown College Band. While at Morris Brown, she was active in the Pre Teachers Organization. Two years later, Herman Masor arrived on the campus (after meeting Deloris Harris at a dance during the Christmas break in Jacksonville) and enrolled at Morris Brown. He as able to try out for the Wolverines Basketball Team, where he made the team and played for two years on the old hardwood floor of the Joe Louis Gymnasium. Deloris Harris graduated with a degree in Educatior in 1956, and Herman "Pop" Mason completed his studies ir Physical Education in 1958. Mrs. Mason, now a retired schoolteacher is a member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Herman Mason, Sr. died in September of 2000. Several othe family members attended Morris Brown including cousi Robert Mays from Jacksonville, Florida. Carolyn Mays gradu ated in 1971. In 1972, cousin Patricia Conley was elected Miss Morris Brown College. In 1981, Skip Mason became the second generation of the family to attend Morris Brown During his years at Morris Brown College, be served as Presi dent of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, President of the Se nior Class and was a member of the Marching Wolverine Band. Today, Alumnus Rev. Skip Mason is the Associate Vio President of Student Affairs/Dean of Students and the Col lege Historian.

Family Legacy

Out of the Island of Bermuda came one of Morris Brown's most beautiful joules. Juliette Burgess graduated in the year 1988 Magnum Cumulate with a GPA of 4.0. She also reigned as Miss Morris Brown College from 1987 to 1988. In the year 1998 ten years later, her nephew Kyjuan Brown made the right choice by attending this historically black institution of higher learning. Kyjuan Brown is a W.E.B. Duboise Academic Scholar, senior biology pre-med major and the Chief of Staff on the Morris Brown College Student Government Association. To add to this family legacy another two family members have made the best choice in attending Morris Brown College. Roneeka Burgess and Jeceon Tucker both freshman Business Administration majors have been inducted into the Morris Brown family. As you may see the small majestic, islands of Bermuda breed not only beauty and poise but intellectual and politically active individuals.


Greetings from Dr. Cross:
