

Believing that the people of the State of Minnesota share a religious heritage which has a distinctive contribution to make to the struggle for genuine equality and brotherhood among people of all races, the religious leaders of this state unite in issuing this call to the first Minnesota Conference on Religion and Race.

The purpose of the conference will be directed to the following concerns:

- to determine the nature of race relation problems in the state of Minnesota.
- to arrive at a religious consensus about the problems of race relations and their solutions within the state, the nation, and the world,
- to employ religious concern and insight in making a maximum contribution to the solution of the problems at hand in the areas of worship, education, housing, recreation, prejudice, employment and legislation.

Time: February 27-28, 1964

Place: The Radisson Hotel, Minneapolis

The Minnesota Conference on Religion and Race seeks to call upon the best informed leadership throughout the nation and within the state to confront delegates to the conference with a full and frank exposure to the nature and scope of the problem. Delegates will be invited on such a basis as to bring about a vital encounter of members of all races and with members of all the sponsoring religious groups.

Since the number of delegates from each religious body must be limited, an early indication of your interest to attend is essential. ### LEONARD H. CARTER

A native of Minneapolis, Minnesota where he attended public schools. Attended University of California at Los Angeles. Served as Secretary-Treasurer of Dining Car Employees Local No. 516 for eight years in St. Paul, Minnesota. Former president St. Paul branch NAACP. Presently Field Secretary, Region IV, NAACP which includes states of Colorado, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, North and South Dakota and Wyoming.

### MATHEW H. AHMANN

Executive Director, National Catholic Conference for Interracial Justice, Graduate St. John's University. Former Social Worker, Chicago Department of Welfare. Former Field Representative, Catholic Interracial Council of Chicago. Served as organizer and executive secretary for National Conference on Religion and Race. Catholic Chairman of the March on Washington, August 28, 1963.



### REVEREND FRED L. SHUTTLESWORTH

Pastor, Revelation Baptist Church, Cincinnati, Ohio. One of the outstanding leaders of Civil Rights Movement, helped organize the Alabama Christian Movement for Civil Rights in Birmingham. He has been bombed twice, beaten by mobsters, jailed 18 times and is currently involved in 36 criminal and civil actions. President, Southern Christian Movement for Human Rights; Secretary, Southern Christian Leadership Conference; Member, National Advisory Board of C.O.R.E.

### REVEREND HARVEY F. EGAN

Pastor, St. Peter's Church of Mendota, oldest parish in Minnesota. Graduate of St. Thomas College and Seminary. Served several parishes in Minneapolis and St. Paul downtown areas, including St. Olaf of Minneapolis. Chaplain and Vice President, Catholic Interracial Council.
