We are pleased to inform you that we have approved your program in the amount of \$800.00 for a period of three weeks to run from March 18 to April 6, 1968. We are limiting the grant to three weeks subject to review and the availability of additional funds. The amount granted is to cover the following: Director's Expenses @ \$50.00 per week \$ 150.00 Five (5) Task Force Workers @ \$15.00 per week 225.00 Transportation 375.00 Printing and Postage 50.00 \$ 800.00 Our guidelines require you to establish a separate beakkaccount, and forward to VEP a copy of the signature card, and an ample supply of deposit slips and the name and address of the bank. The Project will mail a deposit directly to the bank for an amount approximating two weeks cash supply for the program. A copy of the deposit slip will be forwarded Mrs. James Parris - 2. March 11, 1968 to you. You should, however, instruct the bank to mail all bank statements directly to WEP. These will become a part of our records and should you need access to them, they will be available. A report itemizing all disbursements and enclosing appropriate vouchers for each disbursement is expected on Thursday of each week. This report is to be certified by the individual responsible for your project reporting by placing his signature in the appropriate space on the weekly report. The Project will audit this report and reimburse the bank account for the amount spent. We are enclosing a copy of the Reporting Requirements of Recipient Organizations. You and other officers of your project should read these carefully and familiarize yourselves with the requirements. To facilitate the Project's research aims you are required to submit weekly reports setting forth the following: a) number of persons registered, b) method used in getting persons to the registration office, c) increase of number of new voters in the one week period, d) problems, if any, encountered with local registrars, police or private citizens, e) threats of intimidation, or economic reprisals, if any, f) samples of materials, leaflets, programs. These reports should accompany weekly financial reports. Suggested forms for this reporting are provided. A monthly narrative report also is required. These funds may not be used to support partisan politics in any manner whatsoever, nor to influence legislation of any kind, nor in behalf of or against any political candidate. You should strongly urge and welcome non-partisan support of your voter registration activities. Our Director of Research, Marvin Well, will write you regarding further reporting requirements. A report on meetings being held, people being contacted, number registered, etc., is required weekly. This report should accompany your weekly financial report. A supply of forms for this type of report, along with other registration material, is being sent to you under separate cover. These forms also may be used by your workers in making reports to you. We ask, however, that you not send the reports turned in by the various workers. Rather we prefer that you have someone in your office consolidate these reports and send us a single report covering a single period. Please see that each report clearly specifies the name of the project and the community and state in which it is located. It is important that the information be accurate. Figures, particularly for "number successfully registered," should be by actual count and not by estimate. In addition, we will need a narrative report from you each month. This longer report should describe the scope and organization of your program, the number of workers and techniques employed. Samples should be enclosed of any printed materials. Do not hesitate to describe any obstacles encountered, either from within your program or without. A complete and frank report will help both you and VEP in evaluating your program and in planning future programs.

That is to say, we hope you will include anything that seems of interest or importance. We encourage you to pass along any comments of value made by workers in your program.
