

INFORMATION

- BETA PHI MU: The name Beta Phi Mu was derived from the initial letters of the Greek words biblioleki froneos medeontes: "Libraries are the guardians of knowledge."
- FOUNDING: Beta Phi Mu, library science honor society, was founded at the University of Illinois in August, 1948. The society was proposed by a group of leading librarians and library educators who were aware of the notable achievements of honorary societies in other professions and who believed that such a society might have much to offer in the service of librarianship and library education. The first initiation was held in the spring of 1949.
- MOTTO: Since librarians must be dedicated to the service of others if books are to become instruments of liberal education, it is appropriate that Beta Phi Mu has chosen as its motto, ALIIS INSERVIENDO CONSUMOR: I am consumed in the service of others.
- Venetian printer, Aldus Manutius who said, "I have made a vow to devote my life to the public service, and God is my witness that such is my most ardent desire." Gold and black keys and pins bearing the insignia are available to members.
- ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD: One of the purposes of Beta Phi Mu is to encourage scholastic attainment among library school students. It is therefore vitally interested in good teaching and in the development of better educational institutions for professional training. To recognize distinguished service in the field of library education, the society sponsors an annual

award which is conferred through the American Library Association.

FEES: The initiation fee for Zeta Chapter is \$25. Twenty dollars of this amount is sent to the national office. The balance pays annual chapter dues of \$5. The \$20 to the national office is considered a contribution from each inductee for the first year of membership.
