

**NGORONGORO CRATER/ARUSHA—Tuesday, July 2**

Today you will descend 2,000 ft. to the 100 sq. mile crater floor to spend all day in a never forgotten wonderland of animals and bird life. One of the world's wonders, the most spectacular extinct volcano crater in the world, the crater itself has been described as "Africa's Garden of Eden." After a picnic lunch, return to the crater rim in the afternoon and leave for Arusha.

Arrive in Arusha in the evening.

**ARUSHA/NAIROBI—Wednesday, July 3**

Leave Arusha via late evening flight for Nairobi

Arrive in Nairobi, Kenya

**NAIROBI/ADDIS ABABA—Thursday, July 4**

Leave Nairobi via morning flight for Addis Ababa

Arrive in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia

This afternoon a tour of historic Addis Ababa takes you to City Hall, the bustling open-air market—largest of its kind in Africa, St. George Cathedral, Menelik II Square, the Archaeological Museum and Menelik Mausoleum. Then drive up the Eucalyptus-clad Mount Entoto for a panoramic view of the city and surrounding plains and peaks.

**ADDIS ABABA—Friday, July 5**

This morning your tour of modern Addis Ababa includes Africa Hall, Trinity Cathedral, Parliament, the Liberty Monument, Empress Menen Handicraft School, Martyrs' Square, Lions' Cage, the Ethnological Museum and Haile Selassie I University.

**GENERAL INFORMATION**

**TOUR PRICE INCLUDES:**

**RESERVATIONS:** A deposit of \$150.00 per person will hold reservations. Final payment is due six weeks before departure. Go Now Pay Later plan available upon request.

**TRANSPORTATION:** Economy Class Jet from New York and return. Group departures based on GIT air fare—minimum of 15 participants traveling together throughout each entire itinerary. Any deviation will result in a higher airline fare in accordance with airline regulations. A deposit of 25% of the trans-Atlantic air fare is required at least 30 days before departure in accordance with airline regulations, it is non-refundable if you cancel 30 days or less before departure from U.S.A. If there are less than 15 tour participants on any tour or segment, the departure will be based on 14/45 Day Independent Excursion Fare. Also our local representative will host these independent groups in lieu of tour escort. Prices for extension tours are based on independent excursion air fares.

**TRANSFERS:** On arrival and departure at all points between airport, piers, motorcoach terminals, rail stations and hotels.

**HOTEL:** Twin bedded rooms with private bath in best available luxury and first class hotels and lodges. Basis two persons sharing rooms. Supplementary cost for single room is necessary whether by choice or circumstances.

**MEALS:** Demi-pension . . . breakfast and full course dinner . . . table d'hote/a la carte as available. Lunches enroute and game parks. Continental breakfast only in Nairobi, Kenya. **SIGHTSEEING AND EXCURSIONS:** As indicated in the itinerary by motorcoach and/or private car, including English-speaking guide and entrance fees. On some tours experienced African Chauffeur/guides are used.

**LUGGAGE:** At "owner's risk" one piece of hand luggage per person is handled and transferred free. In addition, one overnight hand-case may be carried provided it remains in possession of the passenger at all times. Maximum weight 44 pounds. Hand luggage counts in your 44 pounds.

**TIPS AND TAXES:** All hotel, service charges and taxes as imposed by city and state governments and gratuities for included hotel services; Porters, waiters and baggage porters at airports only in connection with services provided for in your tour. Tips to Driver/guides not included.

**TOUR OPERATION:** Planning, handling, communicating and operation charges in connection with tours.

**TOUR ESCORT:** The services of a qualified tour escort will accompany each tour group of 15 or more persons. Smaller groups will be hosted and coordinated in each country by our local Tour Representatives.

**NOT INCLUDED:** Airport taxes where levied, passport and visa fees, tips to driver/guides, lunches, beverages, food not on table d'hote menu, wines, liquors, mineral waters, luggage in excess of 44 pounds and other items of a personal nature, telephone calls, etc. nor items not mentioned.

**CANCELLATIONS:** Refund of deposit will be made up to six weeks prior to departure; except a handling fee of \$25.00 per person. Beyond such time, non-recoverable payments and/or deposits made to carriers, sightseeing operators and hotels, as well as eventual cable charges incurred in effecting full refund will constitute full settlement by the passenger.

**REFUNDS:** Refunds for unused accommodations and services will be limited to the amount received from or credited by carriers, sightseeing operators and hotels. However, no refund will be made for voluntary absence from a tour after tour has commenced unless the passenger cancels the entire tour enroute, and then refunds will be based on whatever recoverable monies, net obtained from contractors and hotels.

**VARIATIONS:** No changes made in itinerary after tour is enroute; and no refunds for voluntary variations accordingly.

**RATES AND FARES:** All rates and fares are based on the present value of foreign currencies in relation to the United States dollar, and on schedules and tariffs in effect at the time of this printing, and are subject to confirmation or adjustment (either way) when final payment is made.

**HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** The health conditions in all countries visited are good. It is necessary, however, to carry a valid smallpox vaccination certificate that is less than 3 years old and a yellow fever inoculations certificate less than 10 years old for these tours, also cholera shots 6 months or less.

**TRAVEL DOCUMENTS:** Valid passport, visas for all African countries. Information, forms and instructions furnished tour members upon registration.

**CLOTHING:** Informal dress is customary, with both cool and warm to tropical weather being encountered. Clothing suggestions will be given on registration.

**INSURANCE:** As these tours involve travel off the beaten path, insurance on baggage and person is highly recommended and will be arranged on request.

**PARTICIPATING AIRLINES:** All ATC and IATA member carriers.

**RESPONSIBILITY:** Henderson Travel Service known hereafter as Tour Operator, acts only as agent for the airlines, or owners or contractors providing means of transportation or other services, and all receipts, contracts and tickets are issued subject to any and all tariffs, terms and conditions under which any means of transportation or any other services whatsoever are provided by such airlines, or owners or contractors, and issuance and acceptance of any receipts, contracts and tickets shall be deemed to the further conditions:

The airlines concerned are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their plane or conveyance. The Passage contract in use by the airlines concerned, when issued, constitutes the sole contract between the airline and the purchaser of these tours and/or the passenger.

**NOTE:** Bookings made within six weeks of departure will be subject to cable expenses or \$25.00 Late Registration Charge.

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

### NEW YORK/DAKAR—Monday, June 17

Leave New York City (JFK Airport) via Pan American World Airways overnight flight.

### DAKAR—Tuesday, June 18

Arrive in Dakar, Senegal

Our English speaking representative will meet and assist you then transfer you to your hotel.

This service will be provided as you arrive and depart from each city.

### DAKAR—Wednesday, June 19

A morning tour visit Sandaga Market, Kermel Market, the Grand Mosque, Soumbédioune Artisanal Village, Dakar University, National Assembly, see the Palace of the President with its colorful guards, the colon of Independence and the residential areas of Fann and Sicap.

### DAKAR—Thursday, June 20

In the morning take a short boat trip on the Atlantic Ocean to the island of Goree. Located 3 kms. from Dakar Harbour, this little island has known great fame. You will visit the original Palace of the Governor General of French speaking West Africa. The original school named after William Ponty still stands as does one of the more grim reminders of its more nefarious past. 40,000,000 slaves are said to have passed through the hands of the traders located on this tiny island. Visit the original slave houses. See the dungeon and prisons used until the time of French abolition of slavery in 1848. This island is covered in relics of its famous past. Old cannons still lie half buried in the sand attesting to the savage battles fought for possession of this strategic outpost.

### DAKAR/MONROVIA—Friday, June 21

Leave Dakar in the morning by air.

Arrive in Monrovia, Liberia

This afternoon drive to the Firestone Rubber Plantation. Long before arrival, an ocean of rubber trees can be viewed, beautifully planted in rows. The area covers some 90,000 acres and is located about 48 miles from Monrovia. Firestone, one of the world's largest producers of rubber, established this plantation in 1929, and it has since played an important part in the economy of Liberia. A special guide will conduct the tour of the plantation. See rubber tappers at work, the Botanical Garden, factory, and guest houses.

### MONROVIA—Saturday, June 22

A morning city sightseeing tour takes you down Broad Street, Monrovia's main street. The tall and mostly modern buildings include the nine-story Treasury, blocks of offices and apartments, churches, cinemas, and many others. Visit Ashman Street named after an official of the American Colonization Society who played a very important part in the foundation of Liberia. This street was formerly the administrative heart of Liberia and is still the home of important government departments, including the Department of State and the Department of Justice. See the Centennial Pavillion, General Post Office and leading banks. Visit "Water Street" the oldest commercial street in the city. Then proceed to the National Museum and a variety of other places.

### MONROVIA/ABIDJAN—Sunday, June 23

Leave Monrovia via air in the afternoon

Arrive in Abidjan, Ivory Coast

Balance of day at leisure

### ABIDJAN—Monday, June 24

Morning city sightseeing—Visit the "Cocody" residential district filled with luxurious villas, gardens and view of the lagoon. Continue to the colorful Adjame market, where all the ethnic groups in the country sell carved wood, bronze, copper and masks, and the up-to-date shopping centre. Visit the "IFAN" museum, which houses some 25,000 artifacts depicting the history and development of the Ivory Coast. Drive across the Houphouët-Boigny Bridge—hub of all activity in the city; pass the busy commercial harbour and industrial zone. Then on to "Treichville"—a purely African district, where the colorful two story market offers loincloths and pottery for sale.

Afternoon free

### ABIDJAN/ACCRA—Tuesday, June 25

Leave Abidjan via morning flight

Arrive in Accra, Ghana

In the afternoon, drive through Liberty Avenue to Achimota School, where most of Ghana's early educators studied. Follow up to Legon, University of Ghana, which is imposingly set in a fine campus with lovely tropical gardens. Continue on to the countryside to observe native villages, view the Aburi Escarpment and visit the century-old Botanical Gardens.

### ACCRA—Wednesday, June 26

A morning tour of the city takes you along Liberation Avenue to the Ghana Armed Forces Campus, the International Trade Fair Site, Labadi Fishing Spot then along Ring Road East to the State House. Continue to Osu Castle (formerly Christiansborg Castle), the Independence Memorial Arch, Independence Square (formerly Black Star Square)—where official ceremonies are held, various Ministries which offer several fine examples of modern tropical designs, the American Embassy, Parliament House, the Law Courts, National Library, Ghana Handicrafts, Ussher Fort, Jamestown and the Light House.

Visit Korle Bu Hospital, return to the hotel via Ring Road West, Liberty Avenue, the local markets, National Museum and the Trades Union Congress Hall.

### ACCRA—Thursday, June 27

An all day tour takes you along the coast of Ghana, formerly called ("The Gold Coast"), from Accra to Elmina and back. On this coast you will find many splendid beaches lined with coconut trees and dotted with lively fishing villages. On this same coastline are located the majority of the old trading posts, castles and forts, many of which are of great historic value. In the town of Cape Coast, which formerly was the seat of the British Governor, visit the Castle and the University College, at Elmina, the oldest European settlement in West Africa, find Sao Jorge Da Mina, the oldest castle on the coast built by the Portuguese in 1482, and also St. George's Castle, the largest in West Africa; you will be taken to the former slave dungeons and the slave market. Lunch at a nice motel on the beach near Elmina, with a beautiful view of the stately castle. In the afternoon return to Accra along this scenic route.

### ACCRA/NAIROBI—Friday, June 28

Leave Accra via afternoon flight for Nairobi

Arrive Nairobi, Kenya

Balance of the day at leisure



### NAIROBI—Saturday, June 29

Full day sightseeing tour of Nairobi, the Nairobi National Park and Traditional Dancers of Bomas of Kenya. Sightseeing of Nairobi—a beautiful well laid out modern city, set amid flowering shrubs—includes the city centre and shopping areas, Parliament Buildings, the National Museum and Snake Pit. Then proceed to the Nairobi National Park bordering the city boundary. This unique park which covers an area of 44 square miles contains a wide variety of animals, but the chief attraction is the African lion, proud and free within sight of the city. Also, visit the Animal Orphanage where semi-tame orphaned and wounded animals are cared for. Enjoy lunch at the Bomas of Kenya. Boma is a Swahili work meaning enclosed homestead and here you will see and hear everything that reflects the culture and living style of the sixteen Kenyan Ethnic groups. Traditional villages, dances, music and handicrafts.

### NAIROBI/ARUSHA—Sunday, June 30

Leave Nairobi in the afternoon by air

Arrive in Arusha, Tanzania

### NAIROBI/LAKE MANYARA NATIONAL PARK/ NGORONGORO CRATER—Monday, July 1

This morning leave Arusha and drive to Manyara National Park. Manyara is one of the loveliest of Soda Lakes and along its shores is found a remarkable selection of wild life. The main attraction of the park are the Lions, who have adopted the unusual habit of spending many hours each day blissfully asleep along the limbs of large Acacia trees. There are 300 species of birds to delight the bird watchers. Ahe Soda Lake is often pink with flamingoes. Leave the park in the afternoon for Ngorongoro. Overnight at Ngorongoro Crater Lodge or Ngorongoro Wildlife Lodge.
