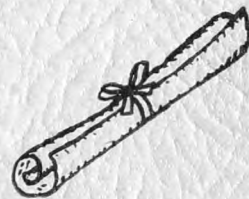

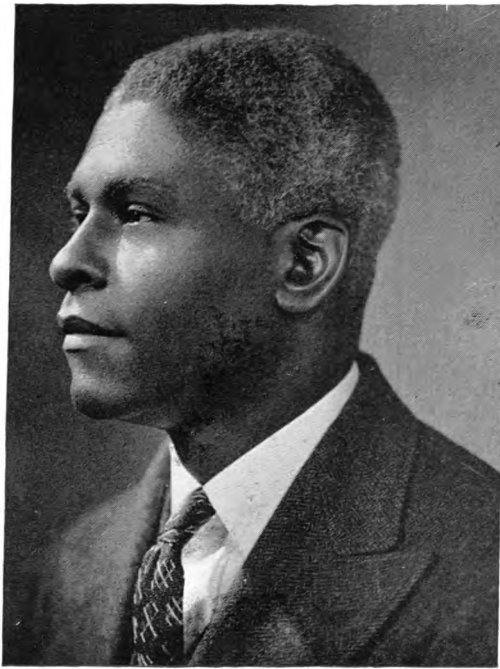


DEAR OLD MOREHOUSE

Give ourselves in loyalty.

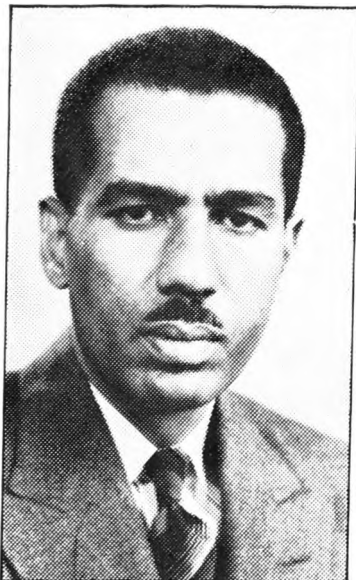
True forever, True forever,

Members of the Morehouse quartet are on the front row. L. R. Rogers Newman, William Bailey, Cleophus Lumpkins, Byron Ragsdale.



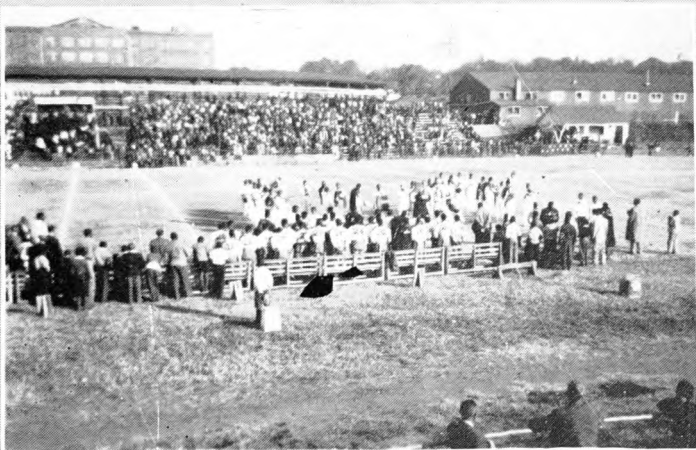
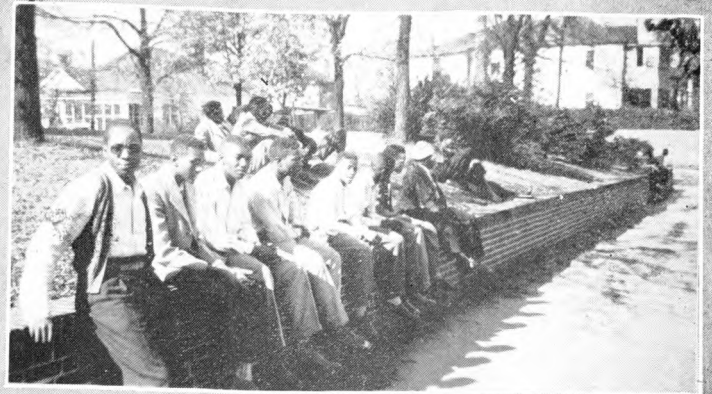

CLAUDE B. DANSBY, M.S.

The best way by which human personalities can truthfully be measured is not by an evaluation of their tenets alone, but by the combination of tenets and of services to one's fellowmen. Morehouse College is fortunate in having on its faculty a great man and an humanitarian in the person of Claude Bernhart Dansby.

Mr. Dansby was born in LaGrange, Georgia, on September 19, 1897. After receiving his early education in the public schools, he came to Morehouse for his high school and college training. He received the A.B. degree from Morehouse College in June, 1922. After teaching for several years, he attended the University of Chicago, where he earned his M.S. degree in 1930. He returned as a graduate student to this school during the summer session of 1934.

Since 1922, Mr. Dansby has served as professor in mathematics here at Morehouse College. These years have been illumined by strenuous classroom work; serving as faculty advisor to many student organizations; recording attendance in Chapel; assisting the athletic department in its financial accounts; and assigning students

to various rooms in the dormitories.

One will find Mr. Dansby very busy, before the opening of school in September, preparing for the influx of students, old and new, who plan to reside on the campus during the school year. Invariably he is the first member of the faculty to greet these students on their arrival at the school. He gives these students all of his time and assistance in helping them both in their scholastic and personal problems. His working hours are indefinite. He is always ready to pitch in and help for the "good of the cause." Mr. Dansby maintains a high position in the admiration and respect of every Morehouse man because he works not for compensation nor for fame, but for the joy of working. He is devoted to his duties and does work far above and beyond that which his job demands.

When asked the source of his ever fluent stream of energy, Mr. Dansby replies, "Morehouse is the source of energy and motivation that makes for activity." Indeed, Mr. Dansby has won a high place for himself in the admiration of every true Morehouse man.
