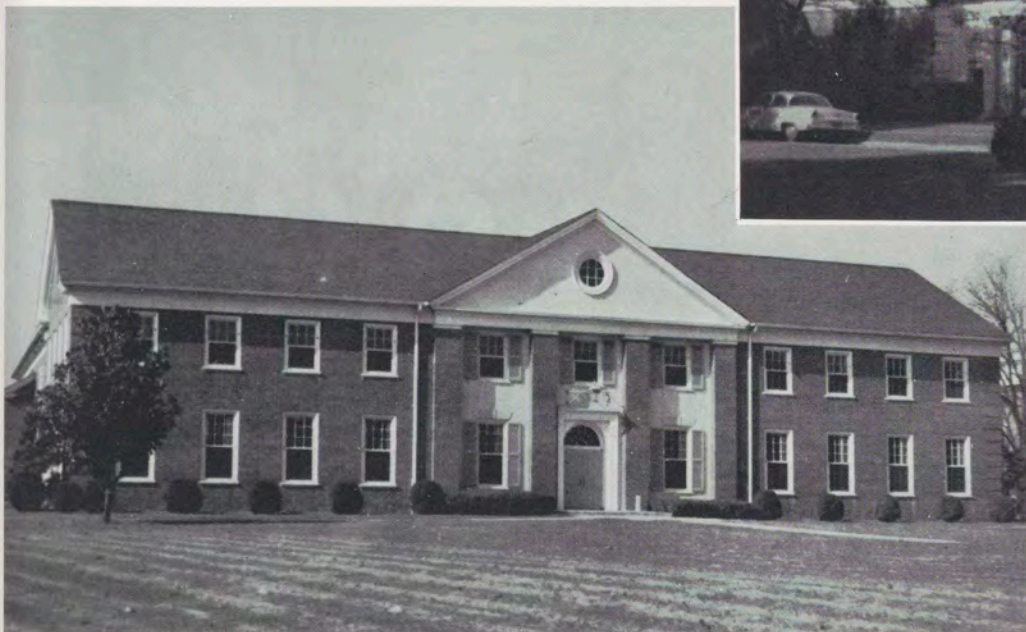



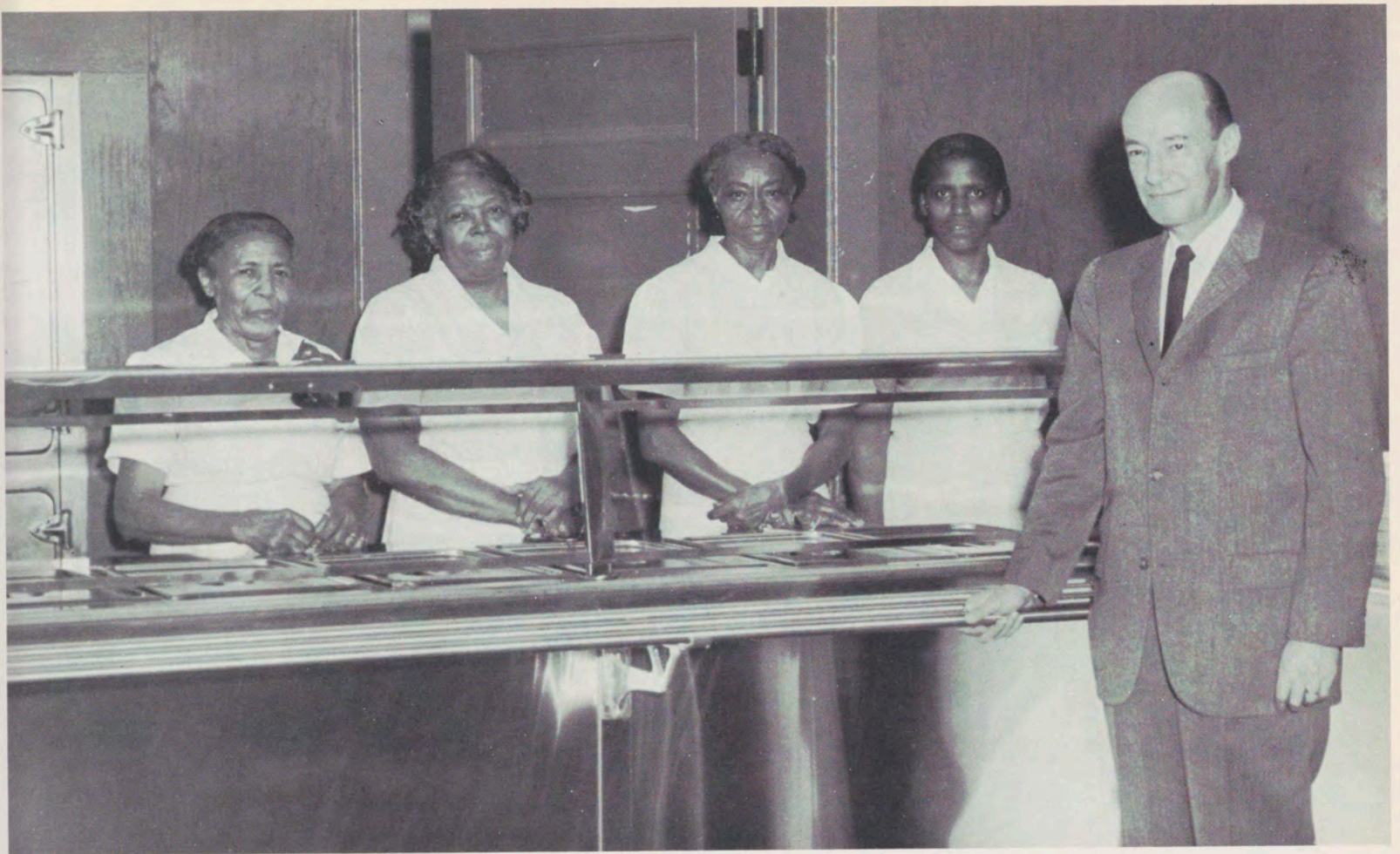

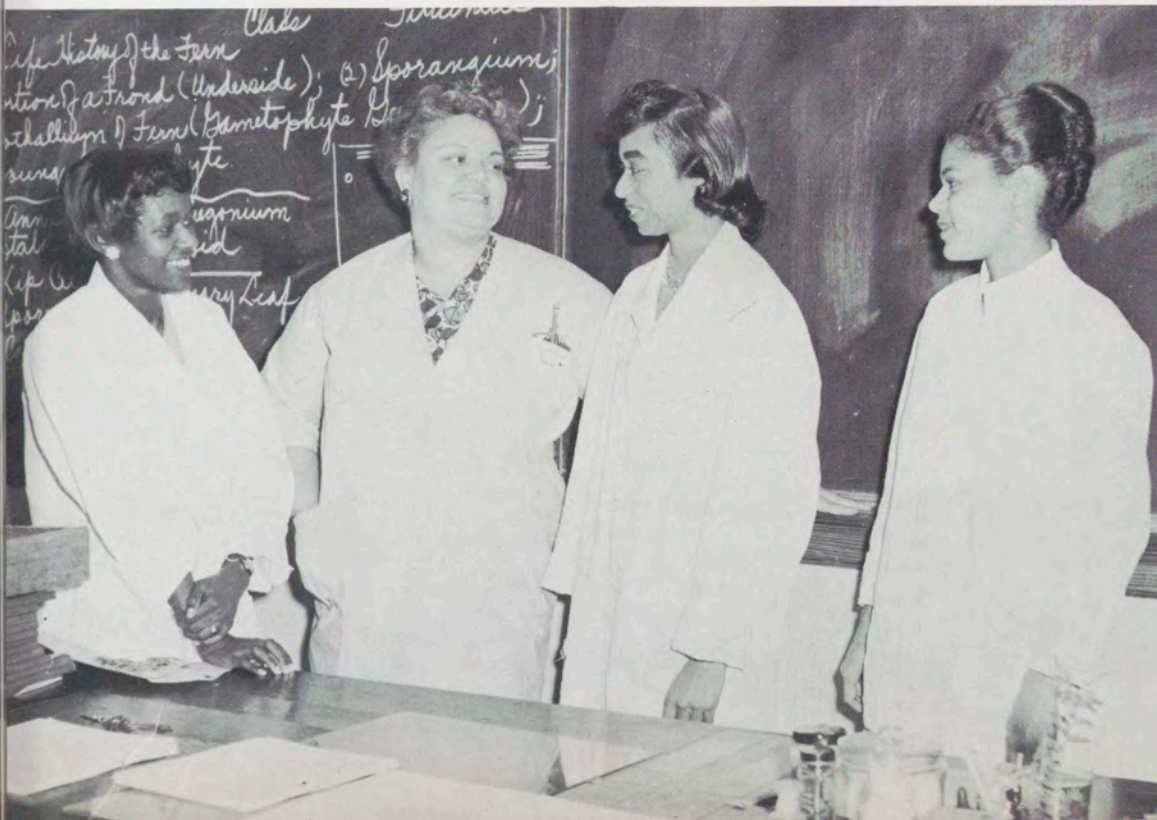
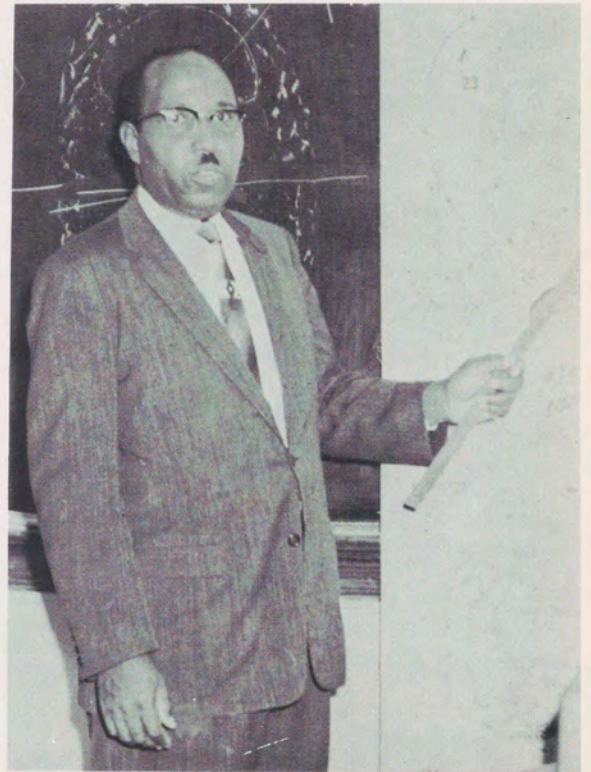




## DEPARTMENT OF BIOLOGY

Miss Christine King is a graduate of Spelman and of Teachers College, Columbia University.

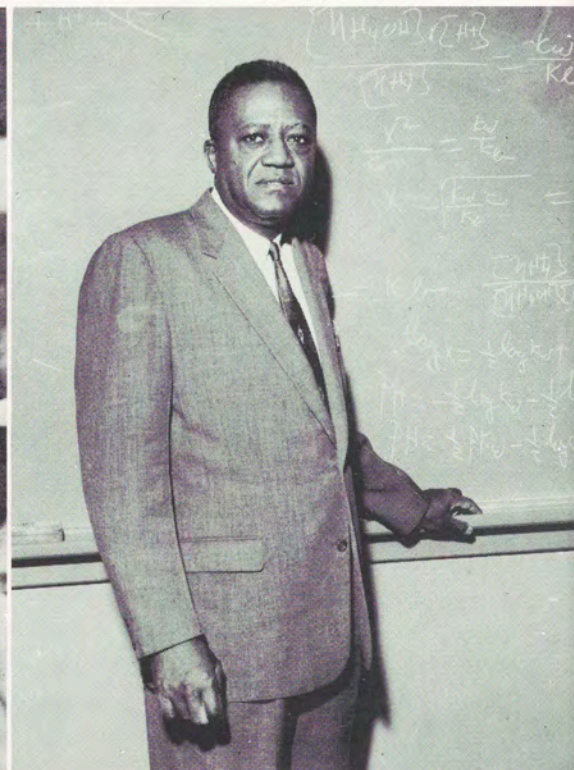

## DEPARTMENT OF HOME ECONOMICS

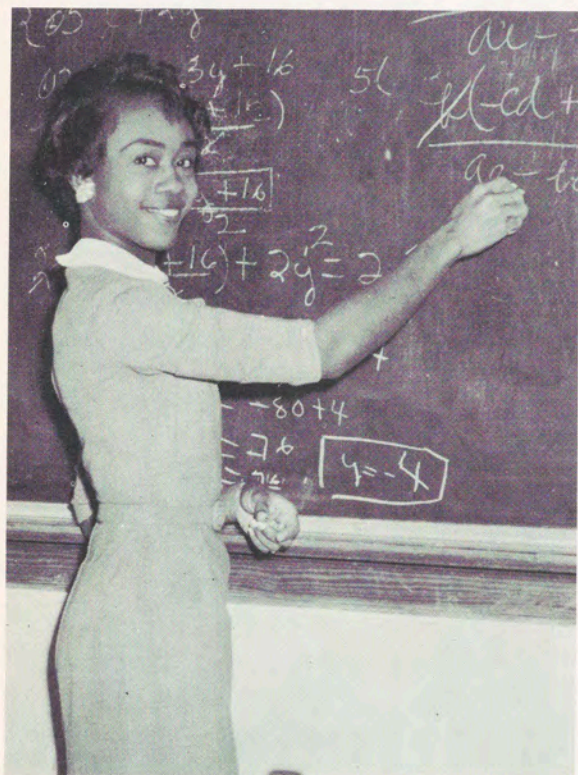

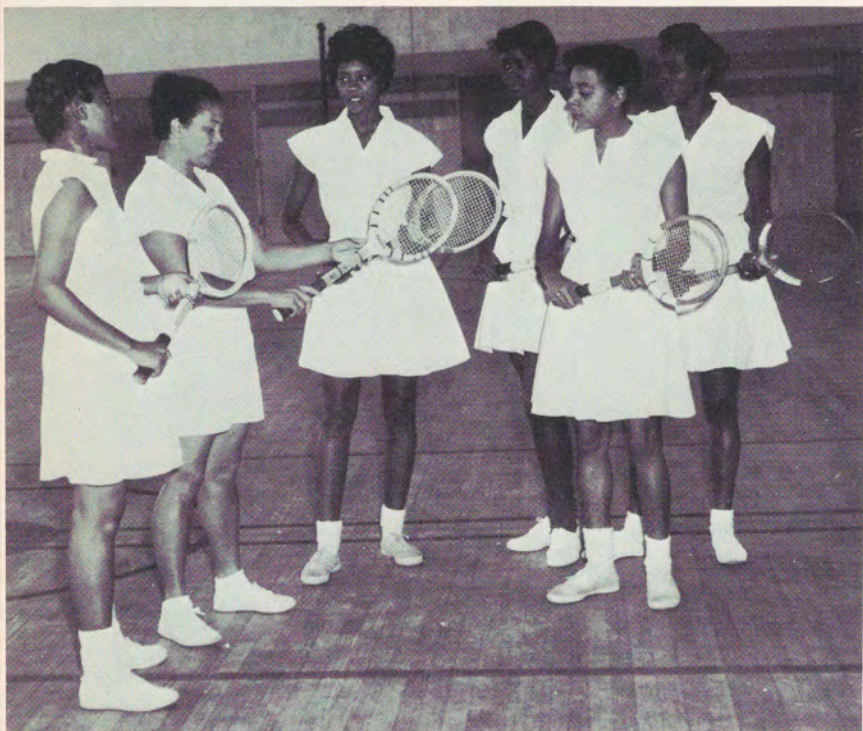

## DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION

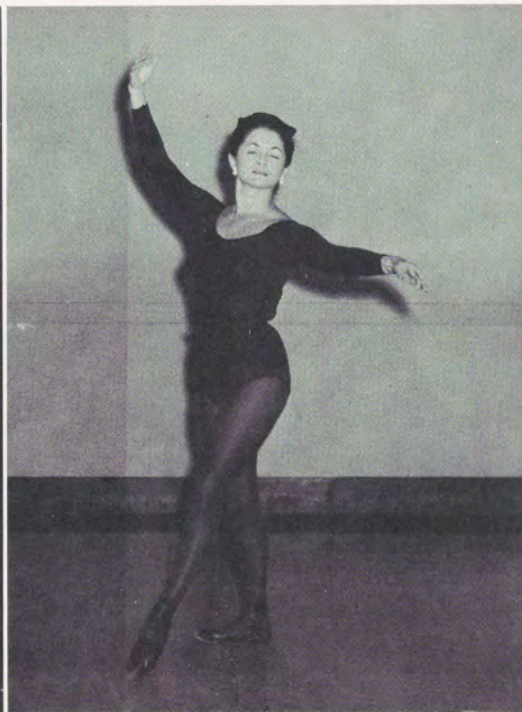
Miss Nellie Randall is chairman of the Department of Physical Education. She received the B.S. degree from Hampton Institute and the M.S. degree from the University of Michigan.

Miss Clare Lorenzi is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin. Miss Lorenzi is instructor in modern dance.

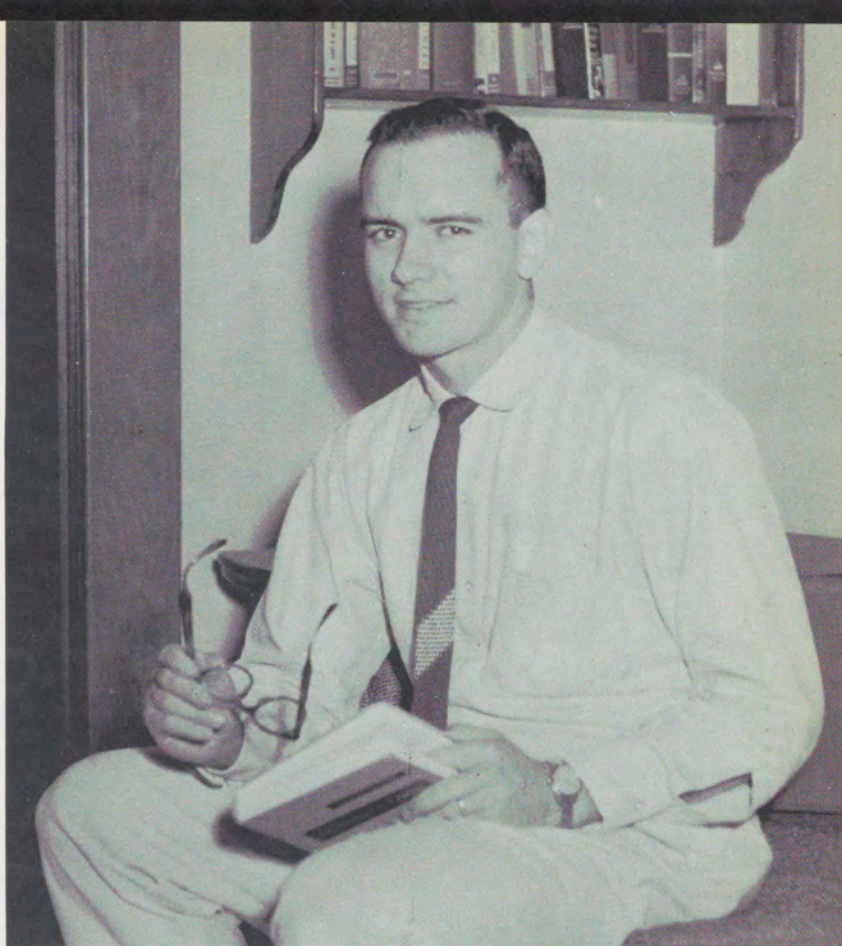

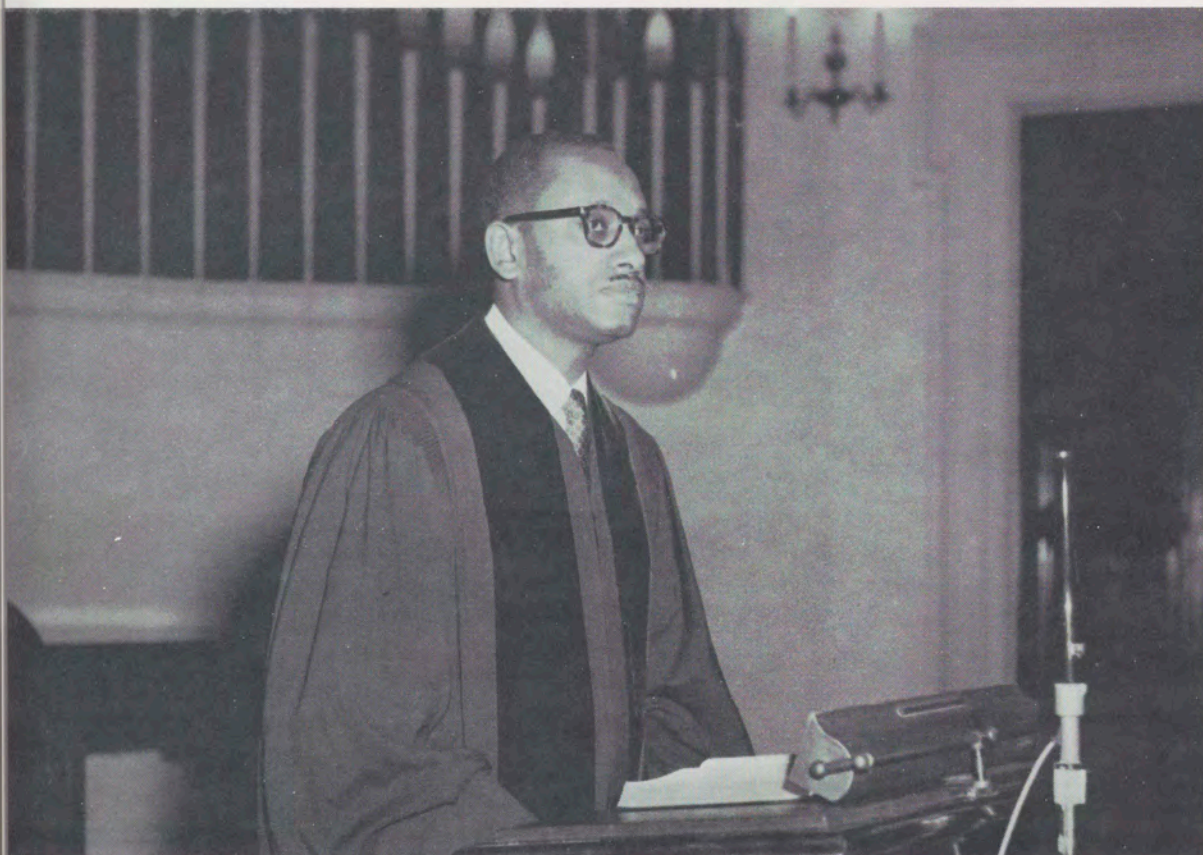


## DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY AND RELIGION

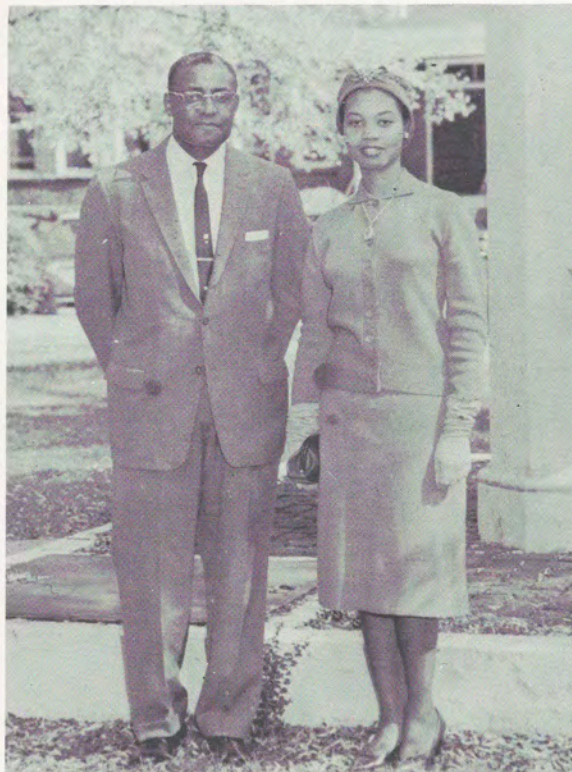

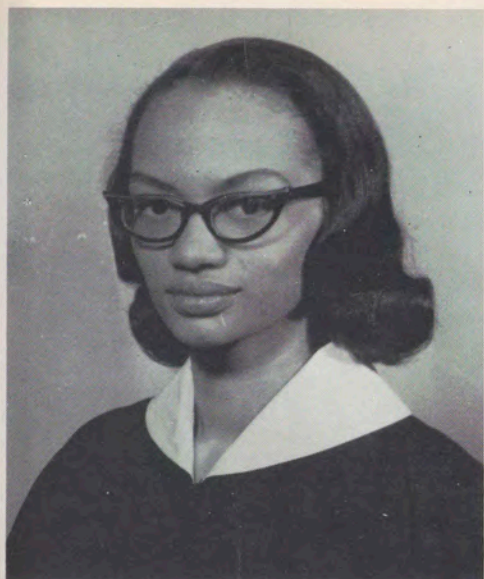

The most gala occasion of the 1958-1959 school year was our Junior-Senior Prom. The theme, "Un Noir Magnifique," proved to be just that—after a lot of hard work on the parts of both the Morehouse and Spelman juniors. 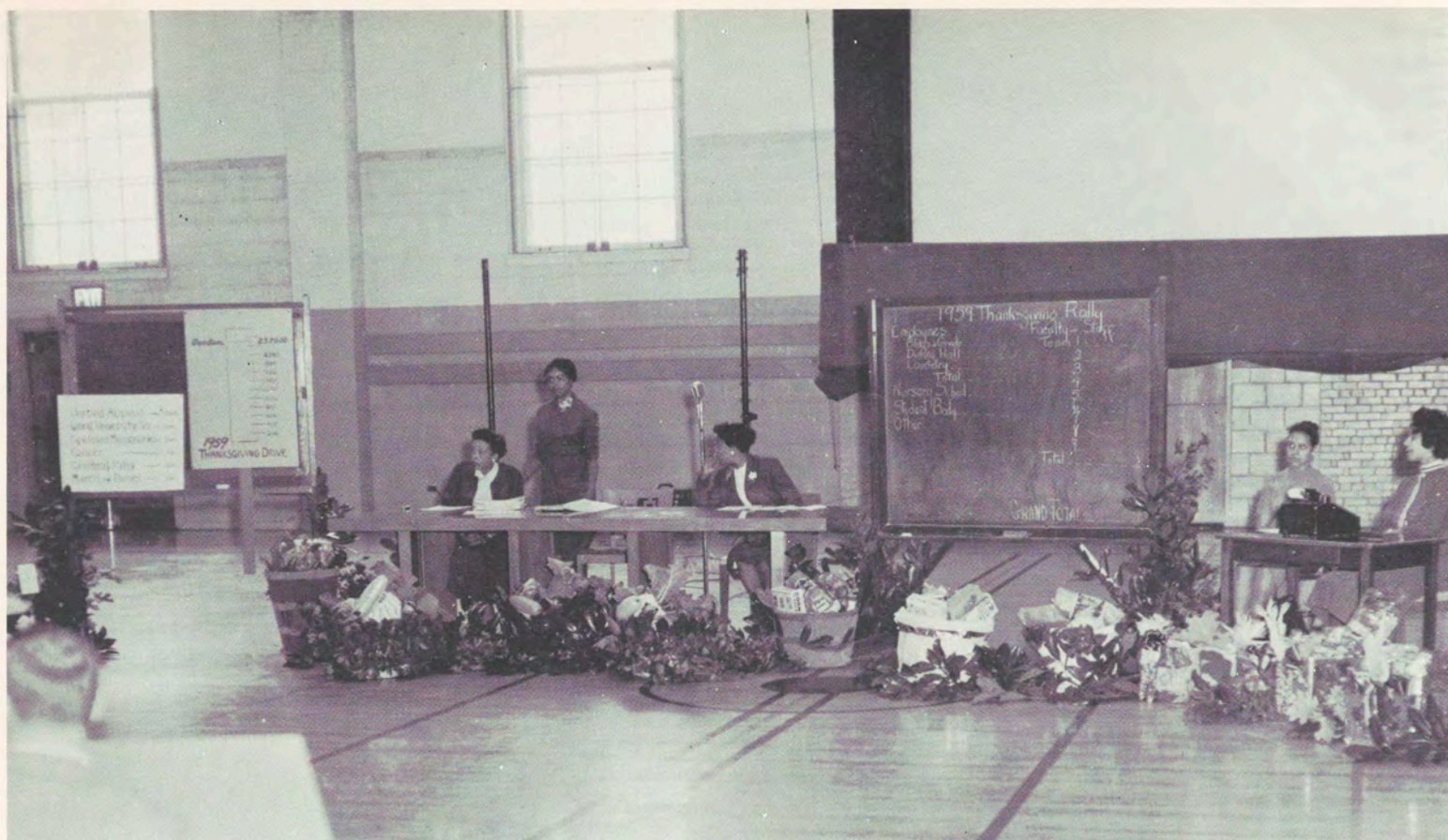

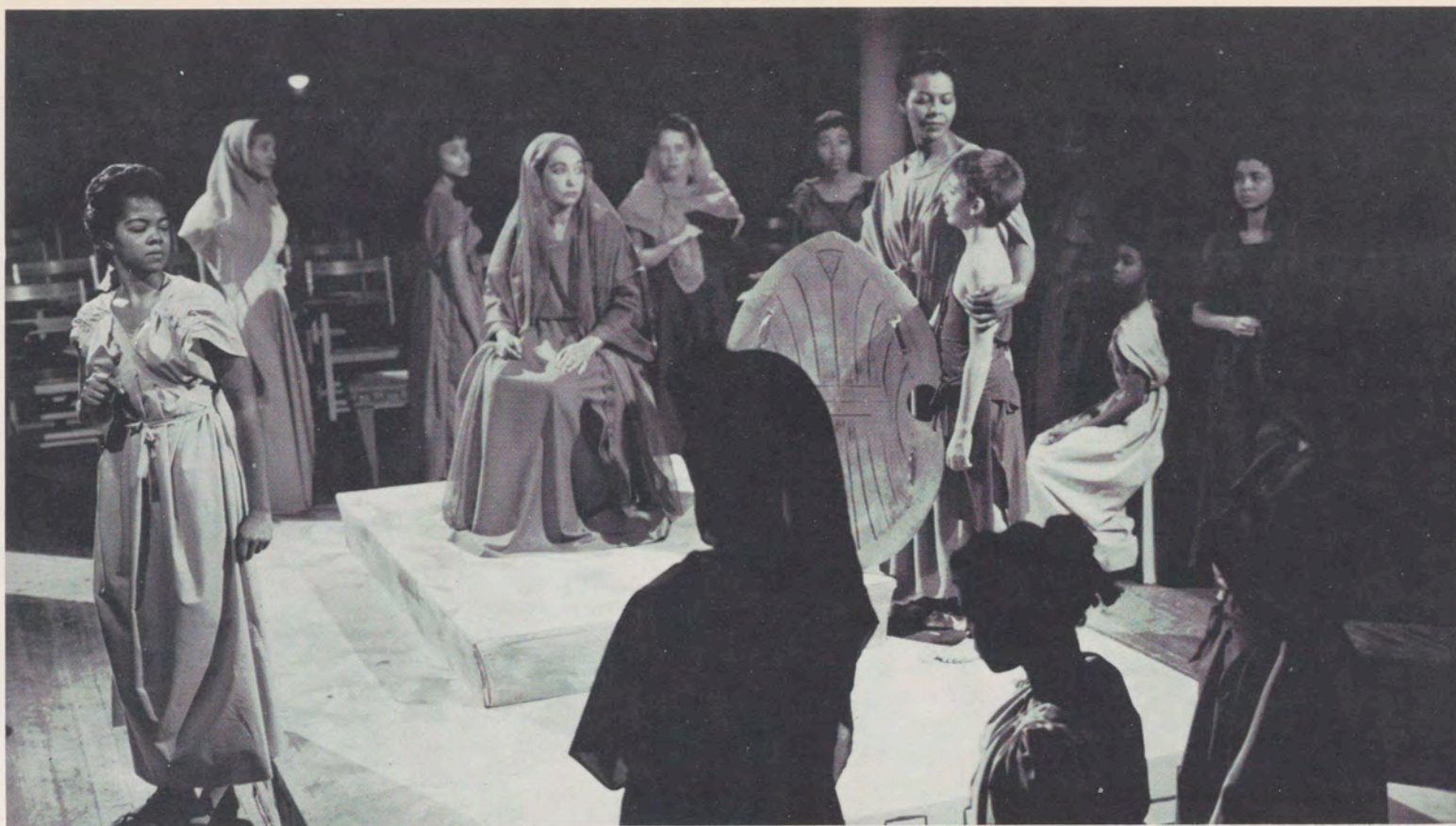

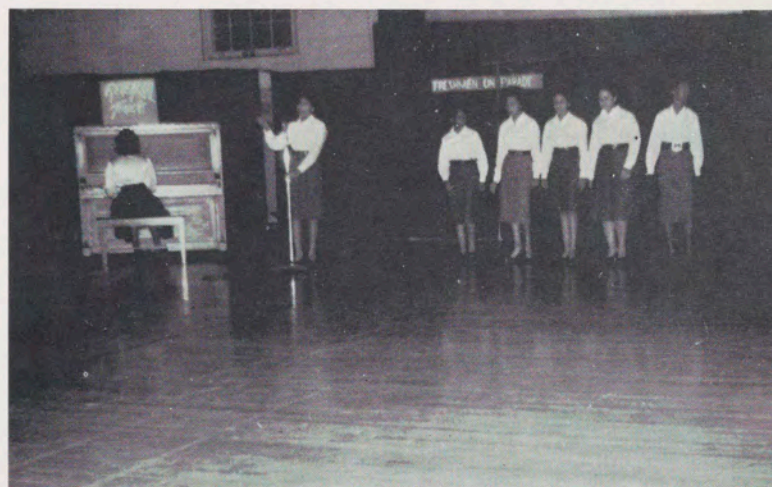
