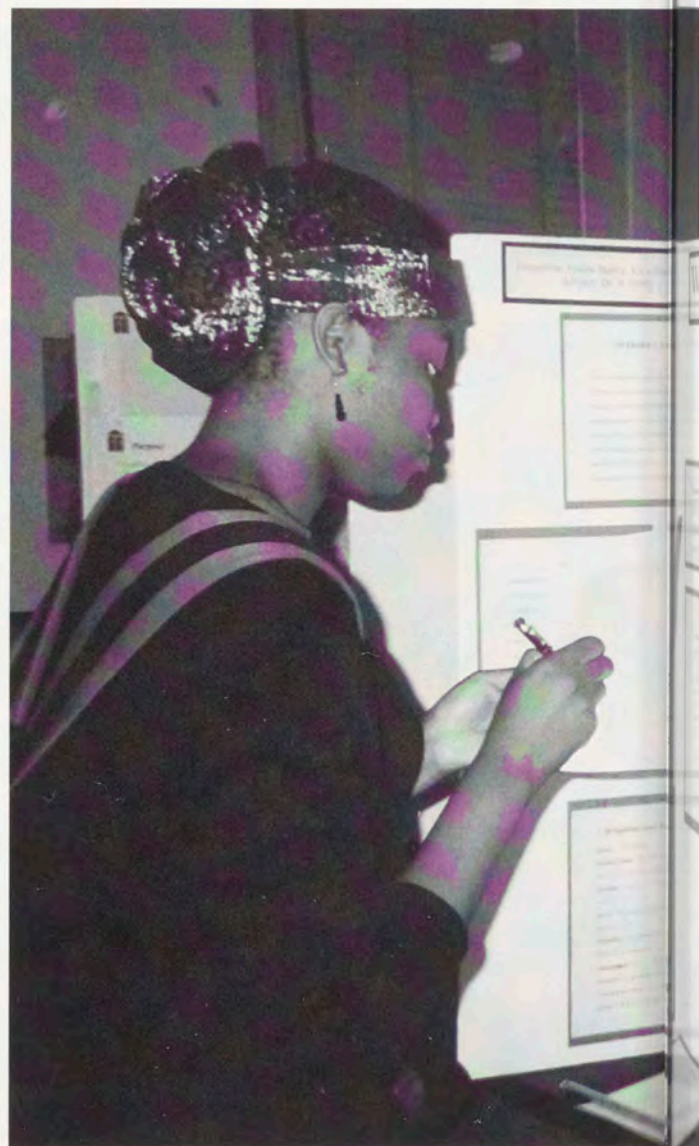
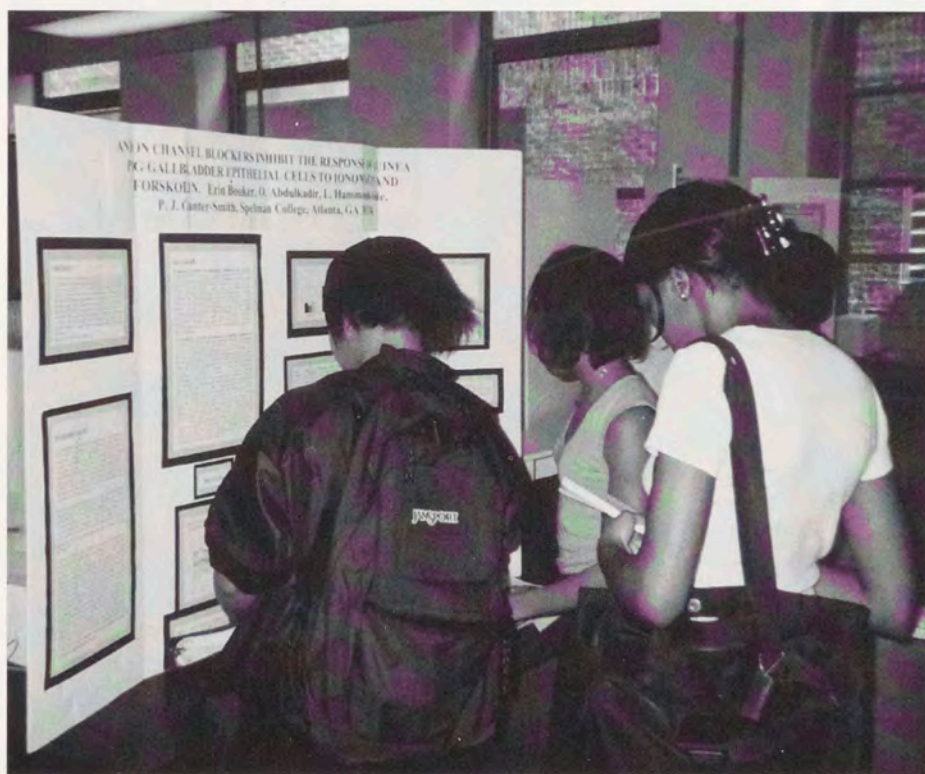
# The Twelfth Annual Science, Engineering, and Mathematics Day

## *Science & Technology: The Gateway to Success in the New Millennium*

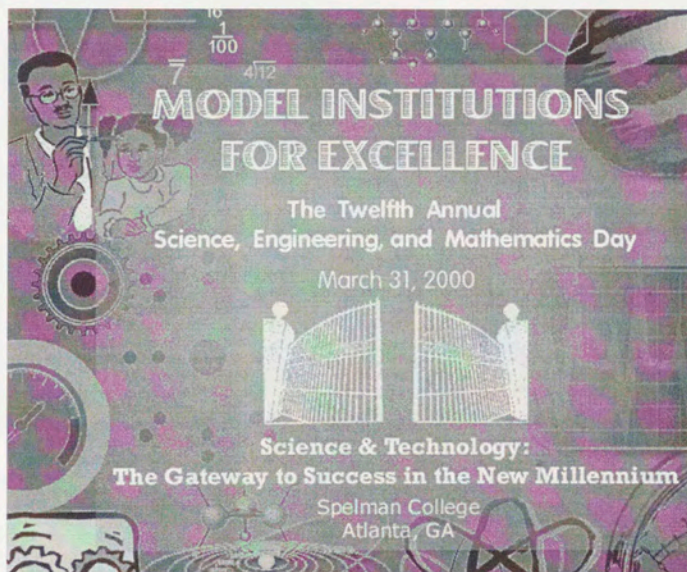
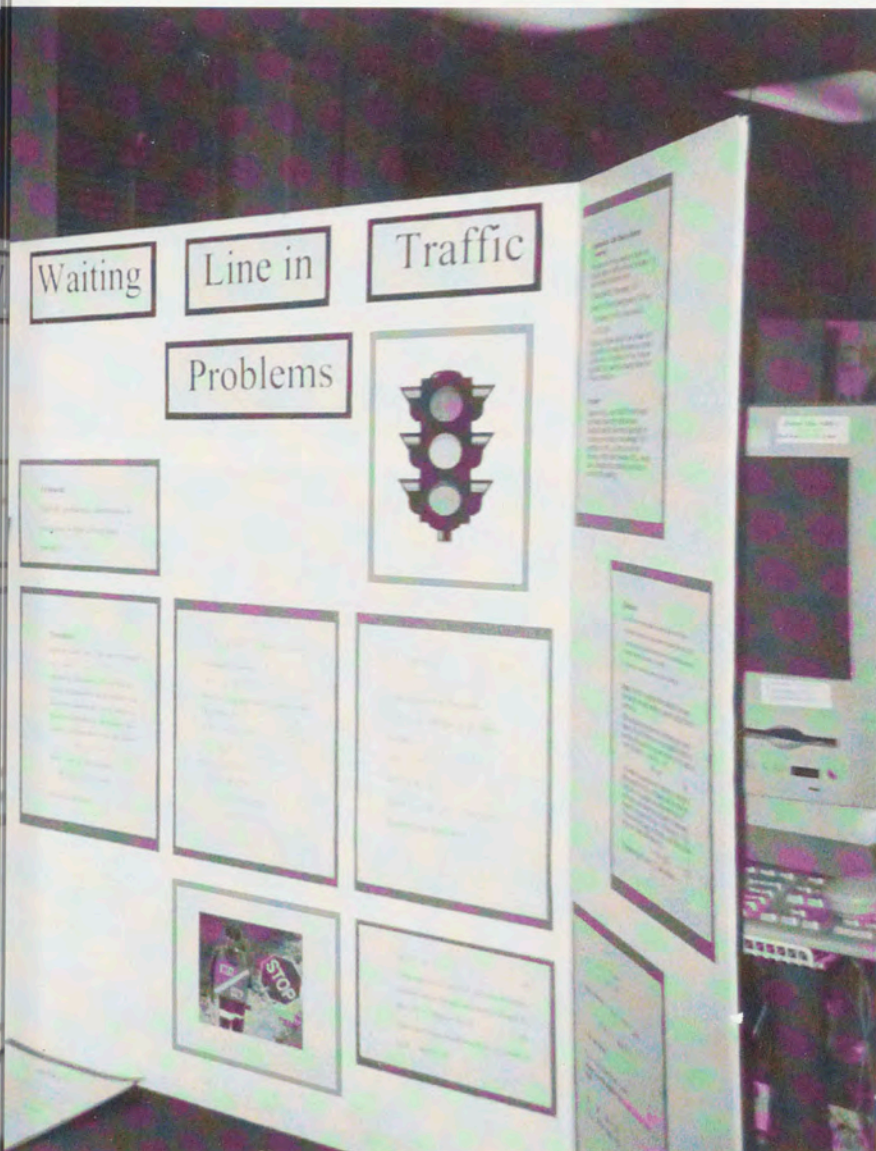
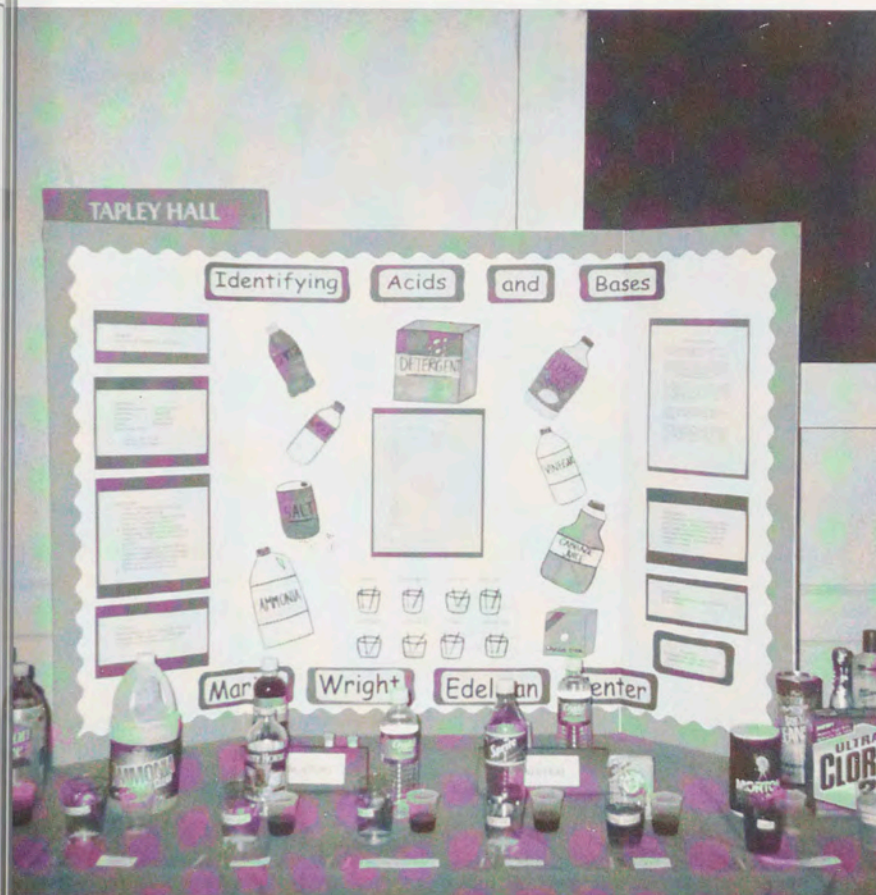
The Model Institutions for Excellence (MIE) program is a comprehensive institutional program whose goal is to increase the number of minorities earning high quality science, engineering, and mathematics (SEM) baccalaureates and pursuing SEM graduate degree and careers. Spelman College is one of the six institutions selected by NSF and NASA in 1995 for MIE which encompasses all science departments through student research and development of infrastructure, students, and faculty. All students benefit from the enhancements in the SEM educational program. Last year there were 1,398

students enrolled in SEM courses which had been developed or enhanced through MIE. MIE sponsors the Summer Science and Engineering Program and the Post-Freshman Summer Science Program, which enrolls up to 60 students. MIE has provided funds for new faculty and staff, laboratory and research instrumentation, student support activities and \$1.7 million for the renovations in the Science Center. However, in no area of development or expansion have the results been more impressive than in student research. The MIE Research Intern Program provides 30 sophomores with research experiences

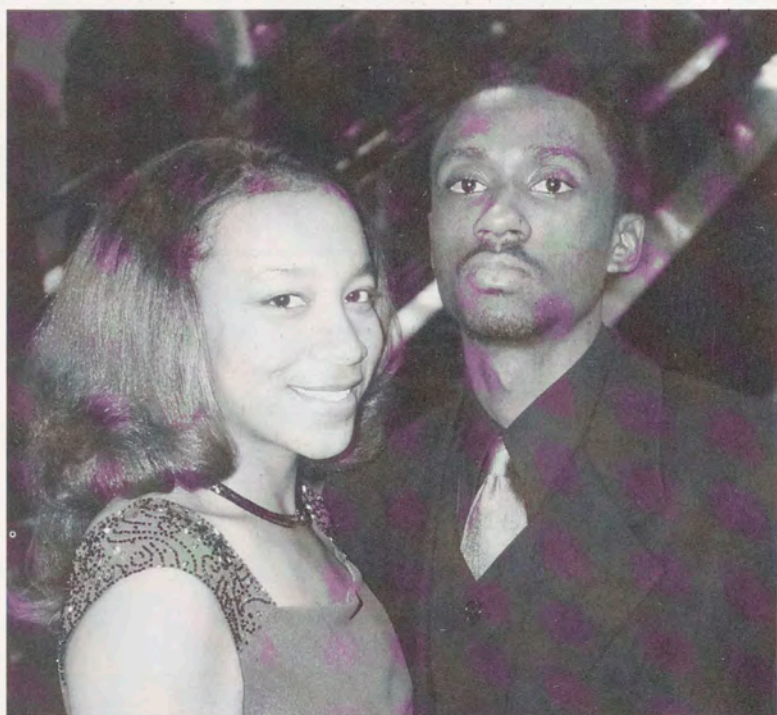
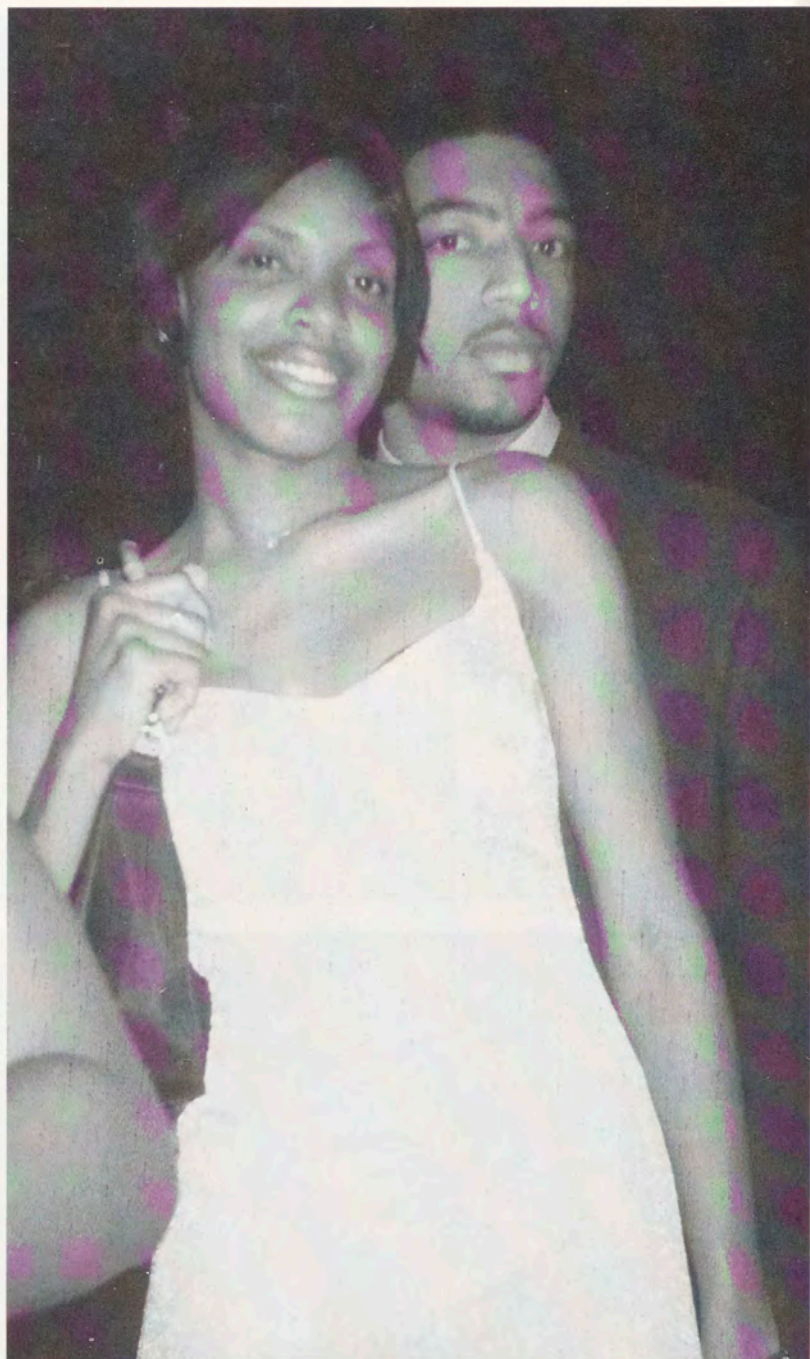
during the academic year. Other students are selected for collaborative research in their departments in project focus teams. Many of the student research projects are exhibited at the Annual Science Day which is supported by MIE as a means of recognizing and encouraging student talent and achievement in research. The Model Institutions for Excellence Program is funded by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) under grant NCC8-179.











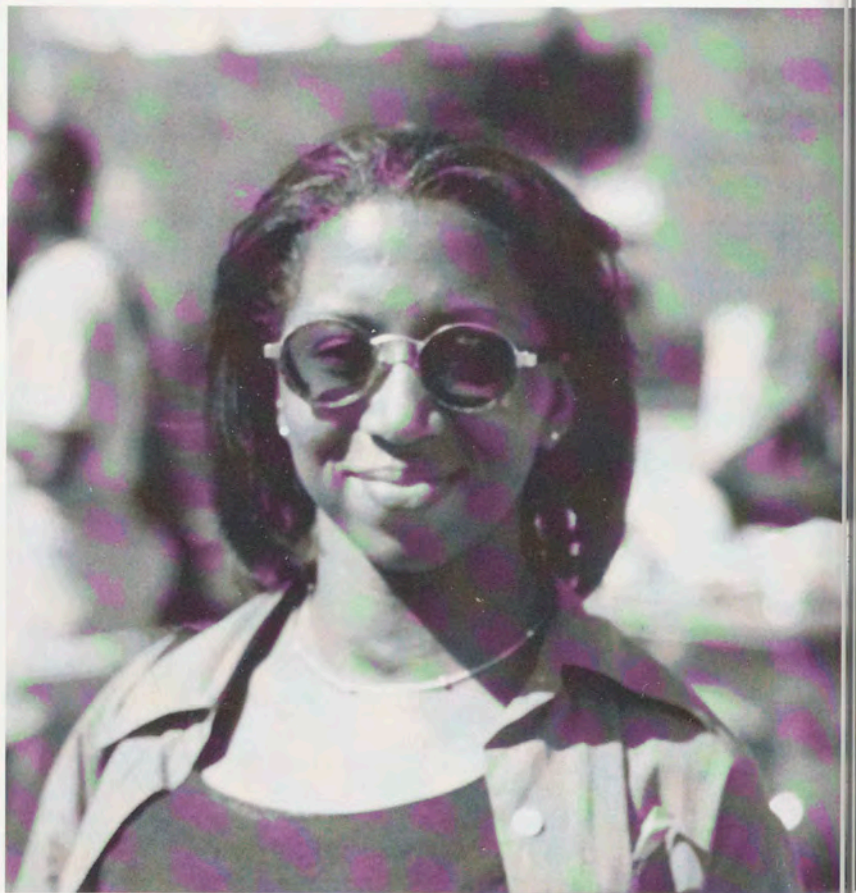

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. was founded by twenty-two visionary women on January 13th 1913; the first sorority composed of undergraduate African American women to apply to the trustees of any university for the right to become incorporated body. These women wanted to develop a sorority that is not only a social, but a working community service group. Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is dedicated to public service; which centers around a Five-Point Program Thrust; 1) educational development, 2) economic development, 3) international awareness and involvement, 4) physical and mental health, and 5) political awareness and involvement.



Eta Kappa Chapter was established here at Spelman College in 1969, and since brought 50 wonderful years of SISTERHOOD, SCHOLARSHIP, and SERVICE. HK, once again, has been honored with one of the sorority's most highly regarded awards, the Minerva Award, for the highest G.P.A. throughout all the undergraduate chapters. In addition, HK celebrated a 30 year reunion in which over 400 HK members returned to celebrate the chapters founding.

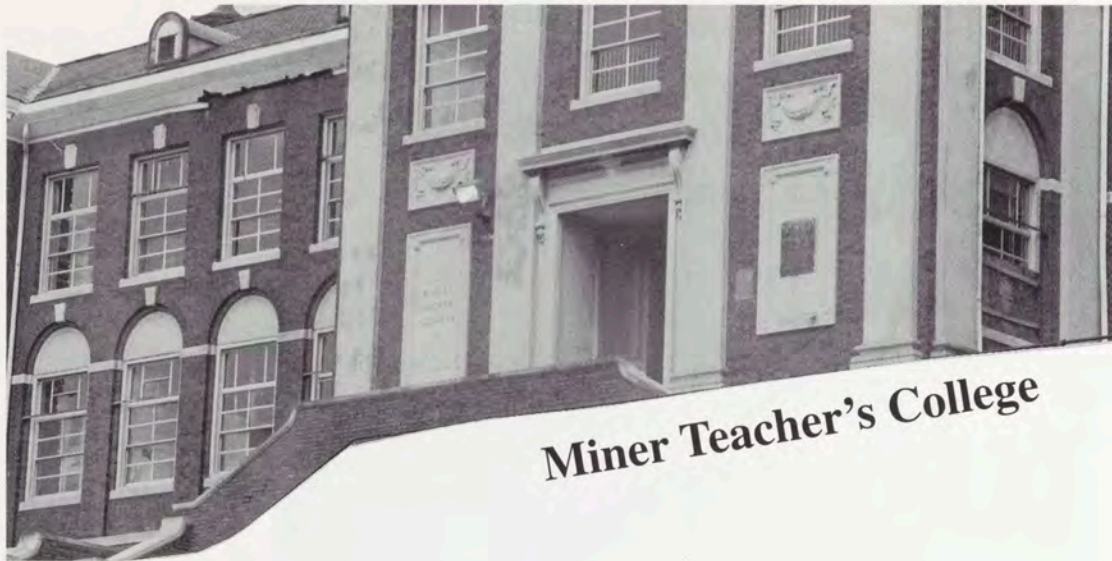

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was founded on January 16, 1920 in Miner Teacher's College on Howard University's campus by five wonderful women who attended the school. The main goals of the sorority, as set up by these founders, are to:

- ◆ Uplift worthwhile projects on college campuses and within communities in which we may be located.
- ◆ Further the spirit of sisterly love and promoting the ideals of Finer Womanhood.

## *Yvonne Parks Catchings*

*Class of 1955*  
*"Renaissance Woman"*

Mrs. Catchings is an art teacher, an artist, a sculptor, an instructor in black studies, a community service worker, and a writer. She is a teacher in the Detroit Public School System, but has also taught in the Atlanta Public School System, at Spelman College, and at Marygrove College in Detroit. She earned the M.A. in Art Education from Columbia University and the M.A. in Museum Practice from the University of Michigan. Also an accomplished artist, she has won several awards for her work. She was awarded four honorable mentions for four consecutive years at the Atlanta University Negro Art exhibition.



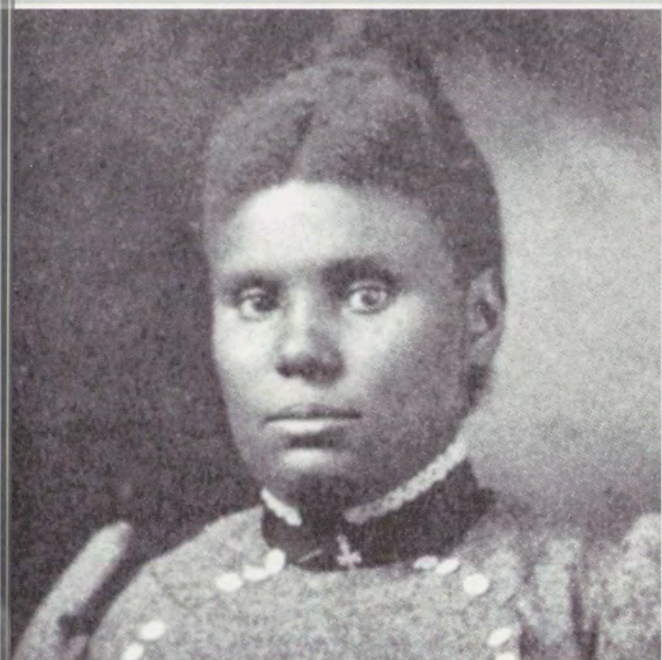
## *Mattiwilda Dobbs*

*Class of 1946*  
*"Coloratura Soprano"*

A music and Spanish major, she graduated first in her class, then left for New York for four years of voice study. While there, she also earned a master's degree in Spanish from Columbia University and a Marian Anderson award in 1947. After winning a John Hay Whitney fellowship, she left for Europe and additional voice study in Paris and Spain. She won first prize in 1958 over hundreds of singers from four continents in the International Music Competition sponsored by Geneva's Conservatory of Music. In 1953, after a successful European concert tour, she made her debut at La Scala in a Rossini opera, becoming the first black to perform there. In 1956, she debuted at the Metropolitan Opera in New York. Since then she has sung there many times as well as in most of the world's great opera houses. She was artist-in-residence at Spelman for the 1974-75 school year. She also received an honorary doctorate from Spelman in 1979 and is perhaps the college's most well-known alumna.







## *Emma Delaney*

*High School Class of 1894*

*Missionary to Africa*

She became the fifth Spelmanite to go to Africa when she sailed on January 15, 1902 to Nyasaland in British West Africa. Having also completed Spelman's Nurses Training course, she was able to provide medical assistance to tribesmen, but perhaps her greatest accomplishment was the establishment of a school to train native leaders, which was in operation in 1905 when she was forced to return home because of poor health. Daniel Malekebu, who was a boy at the mission came under Miss Delaney's influence, ran away from home at age 16 after her departure and after overcoming many obstacles finally made it to Atlanta. He and Miss Delaney were guests of Clara Howard at Spelman for several days where he met Flora Zeto who had been brought by Miss Howard from Africa. They were married in the chapel at Spelman in 1919 and a year later sailed for Nyasaland where they were to continue the work

Miss Delaney had begun. They rebuilt her mission, got the farm lands under cultivation, the school in running condition and built a church and small hospital. Following Miss Delaney's plan, they began training groups of teachers and preachers to work in the surrounding countryside. Unable to return to Nyasaland after her return home in 1906, Miss Delaney proceeded to raise money for establishing a mission in Liberia and went to Monrovia in 1912 under the sponsorship of the Negro National Baptist Convention. After clearing the land and building houses she was finally able to realize her dream, - the Suehn Industrial Mission, where she remained for eight years. She returned to the US in poor health mainly for the purpose of raising funds for further work and was at Spelman in 1922 with high hopes of retuning to her mission. A few months later, however, she died of blackwater fever at her mother's home in Florida. In 1962, the Mission celebrated its 50th anniversary.



## *Margaret Nabrit Curry*

*Class of 1924*

*"A Spelman Institution"*

A year after her graduation from Spelman, she became the first black to be appointed to the Spelman College faculty, and began a career of 42 years of service to her alma mater, her first and only employer. She earned the M.A. from the University of Michigan in 1932, and did further study toward the Ph.D. at the same institution in 1939-40. After joining the faculty, one of her first tasks was to organize the history department which she later chaired for twenty years. She was also an able administrator, becoming in 1946 the Dean of Women. She is perhaps best remembered for her personal influence on students. A student made the following remark in the 1943 Campus Mirror issue which was devoted to Mrs. Curry. Mrs. Curry quietly left Spelman at the close of the 1964-65 school year, but her significant contribution to the development of Spelman into a first rate college will never be forgotten. In May 1966, the Class of 1946 donated funds to start a collection of books for the Quarles Library and on April 9, 1970, the Margaret Nabrit Curry Collection on Women was dedicated.



## *Marian Wright Edelman*

*Class of 1930*

*Chair, Board of Trustees, Spelman College*

Atty. Edelman, a veteran civil rights lawyer, is also founder and director of the Children's Defense Fund (CDF), a non-profit child advocacy organization based in Washington, D.C. The Washington Research Project (CDF's parent organization), was also organized by her (in 1968) to help poor and minority persons investigate and monitor the many federal programs passed in the 1960s to serve them. CDF was established as a means of providing systematic and long-range assistance to children and to make their needs an important matter of public policy. Atty. edelman's work with the CDF and her passionate devotion to the rights of children has brought her national recognition as "the children's crusader" (Essence, September, 1980). The comprehensive CDF publication, *Portrait of Inequality: Black and White Children in America* should foster additional support for this tremendous crusade for children. Atty. Edelman's crusading activities began during her senior year at Spelman when she participated in sit-ins in downtown Atlanta. She also helped to organize the conference in Raleigh, North Carolina, which resulted in the founding of SNCC. After graduation, she entered Yale Law School and at age 26 became the first black woman to pass the bar in Mississippi. Her crusading continued when her headed the NAACP Legal Defense and Education Fund in Mississippi (1964-1968). She was also director of the Center for Law and Education at Harvard. In 1980, she became the first black and the second woman to chair Spelman's Board of Trustees.

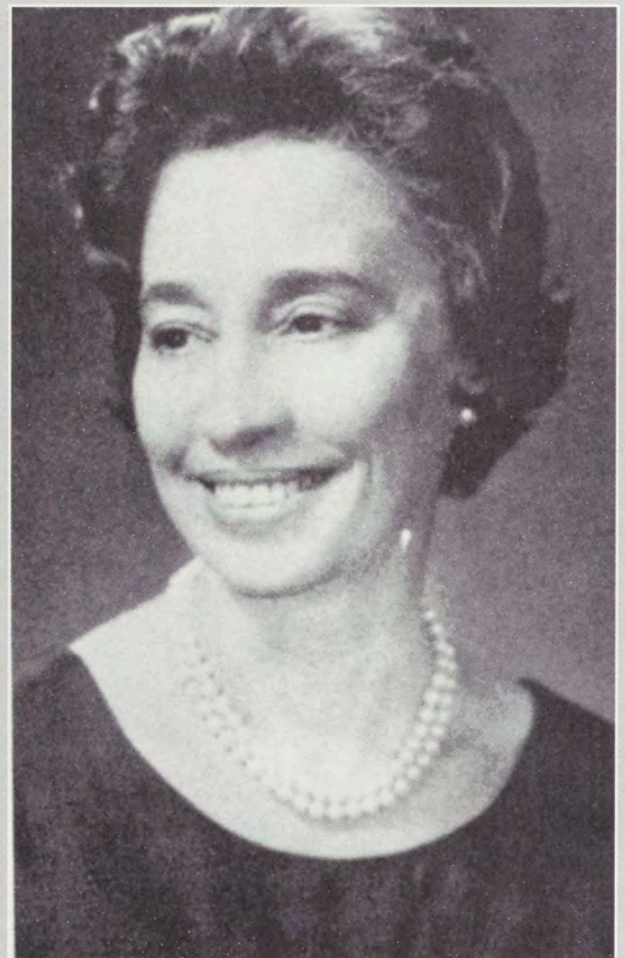


## *Mabel Murphy Smythe*

*FS*

*"Professor and Ambassador"*

Dr. Smythe attended Spelman for three years (1933-1936), and transferred to Mt. Holyoke for her senior year after receiving a full tuition scholarship. After graduating from Mt. Holyoke in 1937, she earned the MA from Northwestern University in 1940 and the Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin in 1942. She has been a professor of economics at several colleges and universities in the U.S. and abroad. Prior to her appointment as Ambassador to the Republic of the Cameroon in 1977, she was Vice-President of the Phelps-Stokes Fund. During her tenure as United States Ambassador, she was the nation's only black woman ambassador. She is a member or director of nearly a dozen national and international commissions, committees, and panels, and has written or edited four books including *The Black American Reference Book*. In 1979 during an informal seminar which she conducted on African issues on the campus, she announced the gift of her priceless collection of African art to the college. In 1980, she was the recipient of an honorary doctorate from Spelman College. She is presently Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for African Affairs.







## *Romae Turner Powell*

*Class of 1947*

*"Judge"*

The Honorable Romae Powell, Fulton County Juvenile Court Judge, was the first black woman (and the first black) named to a full judgeship of a court of record in Georgia history. She served as Senior Juvenile Court Referee prior to her appointment to the judgeship in 1973, and was a practicing attorney in Georgia from 1951-1968. She was appointed by Governor George Busbee to the State Crime Commission and has served as chairperson of the Committee on Serious and Repeated Offenders of the National Council of Juvenile Court Judges. A graduate of Howard University Law School (1950), she has also received certificates of specialized study in juvenile law and justice, and has been president of the Georgia Council of Juvenile Court Judges.



## *Aplha Brawner Floyd*

*Class of 1956*

*"Soprano"*

Mrs. Floyd received her early voice training under Dr. Willis James at Spelman and from the Juilliard School of Music, New York City. Her career began as the debut award winner of the Concert Artists Guild following her debut in the American opera Society's production of "The Queen of Sheba." She sang the title role in Verdi's "Aida" at the convention of the National Association of Negro Musicians in New York in 1972. She also sang the title role in the widely acclaimed world premiere of Scott Joplin's "Treemonisha" in Atlanta in 1972. Her awards include first prize in the Marion Anderson competition and top prize for women at the Geneva International Competition and the Munich International Competition. She has toured widely throughout Germany, Switzerland, and the United States, and has been soloist with such major orchestras as the Munich Rado, Swiss Romande, Basel Philharmonic, Cincinnati Symphony, Pittsburgh Symphony, and the New York Philharmonic with Leonard Bernstein conducting.
